Hope that may comfort them against all those fears which arise from the consideration of a dying hour.

- **Case 3**: Still having much to do to determine if we are real Christians (112)
- **Case 4**: I am in a bad spiritual condition. (113)

- Case 5: It is terrible to think of the other world...
- **Case 6:** The pains of death are terrible (114)
- Case 7: I am likely to be cut off in the midst of my days. (114)
- Case 8: I am afraid of sudden death (114)
- **Case 9**: I am afraid it will be my lot to die lacking the exercise of reason (115)
- **Case 10**: The very thought of death is terrible to me. (115)

A few directions on how to prepare for death

- First, let it be your constant care to keep a clean conscience. (115)
- Second, always be watchful, waiting for your change. (116)
- Third, employ yourselves much in weaning your hearts from the world. Let the mantle of earthly enjoyment hang loose about you, that it may be easily dropped. (117)
