FOR NOVEMBER:

Nigeria

- A church service was interrupted and several worshippers were killed in Nigeria. Urgent and immediate prayer is needed for this violence to stop. More than 80 churchgoers were abducted, with at least three killed and many others injured when Fulani militants invaded two churches. This is an all-too-regular occurrence for God's people in parts of Nigeria. Please pray for the Lord to end these atrocities and to bring peace.
- Two women who had been abducted in 2014 were recently found and rescued. Pray for their healing and restoration and safety moving forward, and for many others who have been kidnapped and not found.

Vietnam

- Two missionary brothers were arrested and beaten and their government benefits were revoked to keep them from ministering among the people of Vietnam. May the Lord continue to provide for them so that they and others can continue the work of the Lord among the Vietnamese people.
- A family of 13 was expelled from their community in a Vietnamese village for being Christians, even though the constitution gives them that right. They were told this freedom does not apply within their area. Ask the Lord to safeguard all believers in Vietnam and given them bold words to respond to this injustice righteously.

North Korea

• If a North Korean is found with a Bible it will be immediately confiscated and destroyed. Those found in possession of a Bible are exiled to remote villages with no chance of ever returning, given reduced food rations and forced into hard labor. Pray for the love of God to warm their hearts, fill their being and spill over to those around them. Pray for God to bring about systemic change and justice in this country.

Central Asia

• The husband of a Christian woman was enraged when she converted to her new faith in Jesus. He beat her and expelled her from their home, planning to divorce her and take their child. Thank God she was able to flee to a safe place of refuge. Pray for her and her child, for continued security and health.
