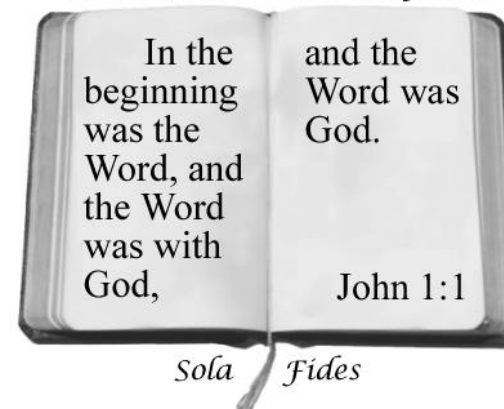

3. Why does Jesus reply to Pilate (about being *King*) as He does in
v. 34?

4. What kind of *king* is Jesus?
What kind of *kingdom* does He have?

5. Was Jesus innocent, as Pilate declared?

6. In all the trial of Jesus as *King*, what is the real “issue”?

7. In what sense are we on trial in this trial of Jesus?
