2 Corinthians 4:1–6 (ESV)

4 Therefore, having this ministry by the mercy of God, we do not lose heart. ² But we have renounced disgraceful, underhanded ways. We refuse to practice cunning or to tamper with God's word, but by the open statement of the truth we would commend ourselves to everyone's conscience in the sight of God. ³ And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. ⁴ In their case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. ⁵ For what we proclaim is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, with ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. ⁶ For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

Summary Statement

Paul asserts that since, by the mercy of God, he has a transformative, new covenant ministry, he does not grow weary, and that having renounced underhanded methods, this open and transparent preaching commends him to everyone. Even if the gospel is veiled, it is to those who are perishing, who are blinded by Satan so they cannot see the light of the gospel, the glory of Christ who is the image of God. Paul's ministry is not a promotion of himself, but of Jesus' lordship, with himself as a servant to the Corinthians. Because as God caused light to shine at creation, so he has given light to the hearts of Paul and the Corinthians enabling them to comprehend the glory of God as seen in the face of Jesus Christ.
