1 Peter 2:11-17 OT: Isaiah 42:1-9

Theme: We will not reach the culture/country with the message of saving grace by becoming more like the world – but by becoming *less* like the world around us and more like the citizens of the glorious kingdom to which we truly belong.

Background: Last week – God's sovereign rule over the governments of the earth, and our role under government. Today – How do we live in a foreign land full of fear and enmity toward us?

Introduction: It is hard to be "comfortable" in a foreign country. Can we really fit it? How do we live so that the gospel is "adorned" in such a way that it is attractive to a fearful, angry, arrogant, self-assured society? The situation he addresses isn't very different from what we face today.

I. We Are God's People

- A. A people redeemed (1:18,19)
- B. With a new identity (2:4-10)
 - 1. Once alienated from God
 - Ephesians 2:12; Colossians 1:21; Ephesians 2:13
 - 2. Now Living Stones, a Chosen Race (4,5,9,10)

II. Sojourners and Exiles

- A. Citizens of another land
 - 1. Citizenship in heaven
 - Philippians 3:20; 1 Peter 1:4
 - 2. Passing through this land/life
 - a. Exiles like Egypt or Babylon
 - Make the best of it
 - b. Sojourners wilderness experience
 - Requires real dependence upon God
- B. We don't "fit in" easily
 - 1. Speaking a different language
 - -"Native language" is not of this land
 - Different customs and habits (being changed by grace)
 - 2. Never quite comfortable
 - a. We shouldn't get too comfortable here
 - b. The more we know Christ the less we will feel at home here

III. In the World But Not Of It

- A. Waging War Against Our Flesh (11)
 - 1. Passions of the flesh vs health of the soul
 - Does not mean the body is bad and soul is good

- 2. Passions of the flesh defined
 - a. Physical and mental sins
 - 1 Peter 4:3,4; Galatians 5:19-21; Ephesians 5:3ff

NOTE: We can sin with *all* our faculties!

- b. It's the *heart* not the culture!
 - James 4·1-3

NOTE: We wage war against the flesh because it wages war against us!

- B. Living the *good* life
 - 1. Consisting of
 - a. Beautiful conduct
 - Colossians 3:12-14; Galatians 5:22-23

NOTE: Good conduct shouldn't require "sacrifice" on our part. It is simply acting according to the new nature that has taken root in us as new creations in Christ.

- b. Beautiful deeds (good deeds)
 - Serving, sharing goods, time, lives
- 2. "Among the Gentiles" That is.....
 - a. The pagans will see it
 - b. "When they will speak against you"
 - c. The charges won't "stick" (12)
 - The "beautiful life" of the believer does not stay hidden

IV. Engaging the Culture

- 1. Will the world see our good deeds, feel the blessing of our beautiful conduct in Christ and so glorify God *now* not just on that final day?
- 2. How do we live in a "fallen" world?
 - a. Do we condemn it?
 - Seek to live completely apart from it?
 - b. We critique the culture
 - By our proclamation of the truth
 - By our unwillingness to join in activities and attitudes of the secular world (1 Peter 4:3,4)
 - Seeking to be a blessing to the culture
- 3. We cannot accommodate ourselves to the culture.

NOTE: Let the world see our beautiful conduct and deeds – and so come to ask for the reason for the hope that we have.

- 4. Let our beautiful conduct and deeds become our way of life.
 - Matthew 25:34-40
