INTRODUCTION

Christ-followers are expected to be grateful people. Thanksgiving is mentioned approximately 140 times. In the Bible we find the Israelites giving thanks in **Exodus 15**; Israel giving thanks in 2 Chronicles for the construction of the temple; we find King David giving thanks in **Psalm 100 & 103**; the prophet Daniel giving thanks in Daniel 6:10. We also find the apostle Paul giving thanks in many places throughout the New Testament.
