#### THE MAIN POINT OF GALATIANS 3:1–14

All who trust Christ receive God's Holy Spirit, become Abraham's children, and are redeemed from the law's curse.

1. *The Spirit's Illumination*. For every believer, God's Spirit "turns the light on" in our hearts so we see our personal need of 'Christ crucified' (see Acts 13:16-46).

"God, who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness,' has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ."
