Parents and Children in the New Humanity (Eph 6:1-4)

Key thought: Children obeying parents and parents rearing children in the discipline and instruction of the Lord honors Christ and His Church Introduction:

- Personal disclaimer
- God's principle means of evangelism is in the family
 - o The qualifications of Elders and Deacons focus on the family
 - 1Ti 3:4-5, 1Ti 3:12
- Paul has painstakingly laid out the position in Christ for the believer (Eph 1-5)
- Paul continues this theme of working out humble submission in the first four verses of Ephesians 6

Main Idea: Children obeying parents and parents rearing children in the discipline and instruction of the Lord honors Christ and His Church

I. The indicatives

a. Called to obey (vs 1)

- i. Children are born rebels (illustration)
- ii. Children
 - 1. Not just little children
 - 2. Considered children until they are married and leave the home
- iii. Obey
 - 1. Hear, listen with attentiveness
 - 2. Implies action
- iv. Honor
 - 1. Speaks to attitude (good attitude without rancor)
- v. In the Lord
 - 1. Obeying parents for the Lord's sake
- vi. This is right:
 - 1. This is God's command

b. Verse 2 and 3

- i. Honor your Father and Mother:
 - 1. Value highly
 - a. Throughout all of life (Matt 15: 4-6)
 - 2. Hold in highest regard
 - a. Talking back, yelling, hitting dishonor parents and God
 - 3. Respect (Illustration: Respect the uniform)
- ii. First commandment with promise
 - 1. May be well with you (quality of life)
 - a. Psa 18:30
 - 2. May live long (longevity of life)
 - a. Psa 90: 10-12

c. Verse 4

- i. Fathers: Previous verses were directed at husbands and wives. This verse can be directed solely at the husband, but likely addresses both spouses.
- ii. Do not provoke
 - 1. This is a sustained relational, *ungodly* irritant
 - 2. Pattern of improper parenting without love
- iii. Bring them up
 - 1. Your children are placed in your care to be brought up by you
 - 2. Example of Paul (1 Thes 2:11-12)

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- 3. It is a parent's responsibility to bring up children (cannot be delegated or ignored)
- iv. Nurture / discipline
 - 1. Systematic training of children (Deu 6:6-9)
 - 2. Correction of wrongdoing
 - a. You must conquer the will of your child
 - b. Quote from Susanna Wesley (John MacArthur commentary on Ephesians)
- v. Admonition / instruction
 - 1. Putting, placing thoughts in the mind of the child
 - 2. Teach the absolutes of right and wrong
 - 3. Make it part of their psyche

II. The imperatives

a. Children obey (vs 1)

- i. Let's face it, this requires living in the Spirit (goes against our rebellious nature) Eph 5:18
 - 1. Example of Isaac's obedience to a godly Father (Gen 22:7)
- ii. Obey Parents
 - 1. Even if they are not right
 - a. Example of Mary and Joseph (Luke 2:49-51)
 - b. Knowing that you are honoring God (Heb 12:9-10)
 - c. Honor parents even after leaving the home
 - i. Show deference to them, make them a part of your lives
 - ii. Seek counsel from them. They know you better than anyone else (Moses and Jethro Gen 18:14, 24)
 - iii. Care for them in old age
 - 1. A godly parent's retirement plan lies in the charity and success of their children

iii. In the Lord

- 1. Paul is speaking to Christians and children of Christians
- 2. View your submission as an act of submission to Christ
- 3. Submission to your parents who you see, illustrates the faith that you have in God the Father, who you have not seen
- 4. To be rebellious is to break the illustrative purpose of God's design

iv. This is right

- a. You don't get to judge your parent's decision making and decide if you will obey or not
 - i. You demonstrate your belief in God's word and His authority when you do what is 'right'
- b. It is right 100% of the time to obey your parents if they are not asking you to sin
- c. Do not talk back!
- d. Do not hate in your heart!
- e. Do not be sneaky (manipulative)

b. Honor your Parents and claim the promises (vs 2-3)

i. Don't rationalize your responsibility away (Matt 15:4-6)

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- ii. Work for peace in your family by a demonstration of faith through obedience
- iii. Plunge yourself into the faith of knowing you will be blessed by God for your obedience

c. Fathers and Mothers (vs 4)

- i. Walk with God or you will provoke your kids
- ii. Side note: A child going astray will divide a husband and wife
- iii. Giving in to your children is setting them up for wrath
 - 1. Pro 29:15, Pro 22:15
- iv. Provocation comes in many forms:
 - 1. Overprotection
 - 2. Favoritism
 - 3. Demanding perfection
 - 4. Failing to parent (not making sacrifices for your kids)
 - 5. Physical and verbal abuse
- v. Train your kids to love the Lord
 - 1. Not an option to bring up your children
 - 2. Don't be a hypocrite!
 - 3. Be purposeful in talking about the Lord and instructing the children in the Bible
- vi. Don't abandon your kids after they have left the house
