The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, and born of the virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From there He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic^{*} church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

This creed traditionally dates back to the early 2nd century.

The word "catholic" means "universal", meaning the one true church made up of all believers in Jesus Christ from every tribe, language, people and nation.

Gloria Patri

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end, Amen, Amen.

The Gloria Patri's first line was sung in the church as early as the 2nd century to affirm that God is Triune. The second line was added in the 4th century to emphasize the eternal Deity of Jesus, refuting the Arian heresy that Jesus was not eternally God.

Reading of God's Word

Genesis 15

After these things the word of the Lord came to Abram in a vision: "Fear not, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great." ² But Abram said, "O Lord God, what will you give me, for I continue^[a] childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?" ³ And Abram said, "Behold, you have given me no offspring, and a member of my household will be my heir." ⁴ And behold, the word of the Lord came to him: "This man shall not be your heir; your very own son shall be your heir." ⁵ And he brought him outside and said, "Look toward heaven, and number the stars, if you are able to number them." Then he said to him, "So shall your offspring be." ⁶ And he believed the Lord, and he counted it to him as righteousness. ⁷ And he said to him, "I am the Lord who brought you out from Ur of the Chaldeans to give you this land to possess." ⁸ But he said, "O Lord God, how am I to know that I shall possess it?" ⁹ He said to

him, "Bring me a heifer three years old, a female goat three years old, a ram three years old, a turtledove, and a young pigeon." ¹⁰ And he brought him all these, cut them in half, and laid each half over against the other. But he did not cut the birds in half. ¹¹ And when birds of prey came down on the carcasses, Abram drove them away. ¹² As the sun was going down, a deep sleep fell on Abram. And behold, dreadful and great darkness fell upon him. ¹³ Then the Lord said to Abram, "Know for certain that your offspring will be sojourners in a land that is not theirs and will be servants there, and they will be afflicted for four hundred years. ¹⁴ But I will bring judgment on the nation that they serve, and afterward they shall come out with great possessions. ¹⁵ As for you, you shall go to your fathers in peace; you shall be buried in a good old age. ¹⁶ And they shall come back here in the fourth generation, for the iniquity of the Amorites is not yet complete." ¹⁷ When the sun had gone down and it was dark, behold, a smoking fire pot and a flaming torch passed between these pieces. ¹⁸ On that day the Lord made a covenant with Abram, saying, "To your offspring I give^[C] this land, from the river of Egypt to the great river, the river Euphrates, ¹⁹ the land of the Kenites, the Kenizzites, the Kadmonites, ²⁰ the Hittites, the Perizzites, the Rephaim, ²¹ the Amorites, the Canaanites, the Girgashites and the Jebusites."



Affirmation of the Promise, 7

- Why did God give them the land promise?
 - $\circ~$ A future home for the people of God
 - Heaven
 - New heavens and the new earth
 - How do we know heaven is real?
- Abraham and Sarah believe the promise of a child- and they will see him
 - They will never "see" the possession of the land
 - Not a question of doubt- a question of confirmation, 8

A Very Strange Answer (to us), 9

- A list of animals to bring
 - Mature- prime- the best of his flocks
- Abraham knows what to do, 10
 - The covenant ceremony is very familiar to him, cf. verse 18
 - The word "make" is the word "cut"
 - Covenants made on a blood basis
 - When two participants made an agreement, if they were equal, they would both walk between the animal parts in a figure 8; if one was a Suzerain Lord who imposed this covenant on a lesser party, only the lesser person would walk through the animals
 - "I will do my part, or will die' (cf. cross my heart and hope to die)
 - o Abraham- wondering how this works with God
- Waiting, 11
- Keep vultures away

The Darkness, 12

- Future
- Descendants, 13-14
 - Will become slave- 400 years!
 - God will then intervene (the Exodus)
- Abraham will die, 15
- Why the delay? 16
 - $\circ \quad$ God is giving the Canaanites an opportunity to repent
 - Cf. II Peter 3.9
 - But God does not wait forever
- The struggles of life, Romans 8.38-39

How Can Abraham Know, 17

- The smoking fire pot and flaming torch
 - How did God guide the Israelites through the wilderness?
 - What about Mt. Sinai when the Law was given?
 - Temple: lamp and incense cloud
- What passes through the animals?
 - Not Abraham! God's presence did!
 - God guarantees the covenant
- God concealed Jesus' identity at Bethlehem
- The darkness at the cross
- Jesus came because Abraham/we failed to keep the covenant
 - o Jesus rose from the dead- guaranteeing our eternity
- We claim God's promises by faith
