Sermon: Leviticus 5:14-6:7

In the trespass offering God shows His justice and forgiveness for specific sins which violate God's rights and man's rights.

We see:

- The specific sins which "trespass" against God and cause man to be guilty before Him.
- 2. The specific sins which "trespass" against one's neighbor and cause man to be guilty before God.
- 3. God's forgiveness is known through confession of guilt and through payment by (a) an offering and (b) making restitution.

The church is called to be a confessing church, that she may be,

the pillar and ground of the truth (1Tim. 3:15,16)

The Heidelberg Catechism

- 12. Q. Since, according to God's righteous judgment we deserve temporal and eternal punishment, how can we escape this punishment and be again received into favor?
- **<u>A.</u>** God demands that His justice be satisfied.[1] Therefore full payment must be made either by ourselves or by another.[2]

[1] Ex. 20:5; 23:7; Rom. 2:1-11. [2] Is. 53:11; Rom. 8:3, 4.

- 13. Q. Can we ourselves make this payment?
- A. Certainly not. On the contrary, we daily increase our debt.[1] [1] Ps. 130:3; Matt. 6:12; Rom. 2:4, 5.
- **14. Q.** Can any mere creature pay for us?
- A. No. In the first place, God will not punish another creature for the sin which man has committed.[1] Furthermore, no mere creature can sustain the burden of God's eternal wrath against sin and deliver others from it.[2]

- **18. Q.** But who is that Mediator who at the same time is true God and a true and righteous man?
- A. Our Lord Jesus Christ,[1] whom God made our wisdom, our righteousness and sanctification and redemption (1Cor. 1:30).

 [1] Matt. 1:21-23; Luke 2:11; 1Tim. 2:5; 3:16.
- **19. Q.** From where do you know this?
- A. From the holy gospel, which God Himself first revealed in Paradise.[1] Later, He had it proclaimed by the patriarchs[2] and prophets,[3] and foreshadowed by the sacrifices and other ceremonies of the law.[4] Finally, He had it fulfilled through His only Son.[5]


