What is a Thematic Study?

Purpose of Thematic Method

- 1. Discover what you can about a chosen theme.
- 2. Try to find the answer to the questions you have come up with.

The Thematic Differs From Topical in These Ways

- 1. Thematic is a shorter type of study because you study less verses.
- \star Thematic is a theme within a topic.
- Topical every verse
- Thematic only deal with scriptures that relate to your questions.
- 2. Thematic consists of many less questions.

Advantages of the Thematic Method

- 1. You don't need as many reference tools.
- 2. You use this method when you don't have time for full scale topical study.
- 3. It is a good way to preview a topic by surveying the high points of it's subordinate themes before attempting a regular topical study (preview to get you prepared for a topical)
- 4. It is a good method to teach someone, being the easiest one to teach.

Doing the Thematic Method

TOOLS:

- 1. Bible (NO STUDY BIBLE)
- 2. Concordance Only gives verses that ACTUALLY use the word
- 3. Topical Bible All verses that may be related to subject

STEPS:

- 1. Choose the theme.
- 2. Decide on the questions.
- \star Write down your questions and narrow it down to 5
- 3. Create a list of all the verses you intend to study.
- 4. Start asking your questions to EACH reference.
- ★ Write down the answers you find on your paper
 - a. Write question
 - b. Write whole verse
 - c. Identify how it answered
- 5. Conclusion
 - a. Summarize the answers to each of the questions
 - b. You may organize it into an outline
- 6. Application
 - a. Personal
 - b. Practical
 - c. Possible
 - d. Measurable

DANGERS:

- 1. Don't use too many questions (NO MORE THAN 5)
- 2. Sometimes you can do a thematic study with one question.
- 3. Many times you will not find the answer to all of your questions.
- 4. If you are not finding answers, you should note that you need to revise your questions FINISH THE STUDY (DO NOT REVISE IN THE MIDDLE)
- 5. If you want to know EVERYTHING God has to say about a topic, you need to do a topical study.
