 $\rightarrow$ Aim for a full-orbed, robust presentation of the gospel.

 $\rightarrow$ Conviction is not conversion.

 $\rightarrow$ Procrastination is a thief.

 $\rightarrow$ As a man and a minister, Paul is an example of integrity, patience, and confident trust in the Lord.
