

Chapter 9 – 11 God's Soveriegnty vs. Man's Responsibility. In line with the nature of the problem Paul is dealing with, he frequently mentions God in chapters 9 to 11 (twenty-six times 9 – Has The Promises of God failed? His Character 10 –Has The Word of God has failed? His Word 11 – Has The Plan of God has failed? His Plan To Understand God's Sovereignty is to consider the:

I. Creator –"Him that formed it" (vs 19-23)

God is:

A. Greater – "who has resisted His will "

B. Omniscient – "*Why has thou made me thus*" For who has known the mind of the Lord, or who became His counselor?

C. **O**mnipotent – "power over the clay"

D. **D**emonstrative – "that He might make known"

God has taken it on Himself to declare Himself to Us and in front of the whole Universe. God is not hidden and does not want to be hidden. II. Chosen – "that the purpose of God...might stand " (vs 24-29)

God's Chosen are :

A. **B**eckoned – "whom he hath called"

John 6:44

No man can come to me, except the Father which hath sent me draw him:

B. Adopted – "be called the children of God"

C. Depraved –" as Sodoma, and been....Gomorrha" Reprobate is a synonym

Paired with the rejection or suppression of Truth. Rom. 1:28; I Tim 6:5; II Tim. 3:8

To be rendered unfit and needing to be rejected or cast away.

III. Clumsy – "they stumbled at the stumblingstone" (vs 30-33)

God's Plan includes the :

A. Unconventional - "followed not after righteousness" Salvation does not come through Organized Religion. Religion is the distraction that leads to stumbling.

B. Guilty - "hath not attained to the law of righteousness" The reality is that Salvation can not take place until we come to an awareness that we need to be saved. Only Lost people can be saved, thus we have to realize we are lost or guilty first before we desire grace and mercy.

C. Lumbering – "for they stumbled" Stumbling happens when we are preoccupied or filled with something that gives us an inability to take the right steps (Illustration of Drunk Drivers ... Tests given) D. Yielded – "whosoever believeth on Him" Faith is to give way to God's Word and prefer it to your own ideas.
