Naboth's Vineyard

1 Kings 21:1-29

I. AHAB'S CHARACTER

- A. <u>His Crime</u>: murder and theft, but this included many other sins (v. 19)
 - **1. Abuse of Authority** (v. 22b; Ezek 34:2-3; Lk 12:48)
 - **2.** <u>Covetousness</u> (Ex 20:7)—10th commandment
 - **3.** <u>Conspiracy</u>—involved and compelled *others* to sin
 - **a.** <u>False Witness</u> (Ex 20:16)—9th commandment; corrupt legal system
 - **b.** Murder (Ex 20:13; Deut 24:16; 2 Kings 9:26)—6th command
 - **4.** Theft (Ex 20:15)—8th commandment; taking Naboth's property

B. <u>His Nature</u>

- **1. Morally** weak—a spineless man with a smidgeon of conscience!
- 2. <u>Sulks</u> when thwarted (v. 4)—acts like a spoiled child
- 3. Slave of Sin (vs. 20, 25-26)—gave himself over to it
- **C. <u>His Marriage</u>** (v. 25)
 - **1. A Marriage of Equals**—**rare** in that day
 - Sometimes a peaceful marriage means worshipping same idols.
 - **2.** <u>Codependent</u> Relationship (v. 7)—work in tandem, support in sin

II. GOD'S CHARACTER

- **A. He is Just.** (Ex 34:7; Ps 103:6; Na 1:3)
 - **1.** Every person, great or small, is accountable to God. (Lev 19:15; Job 34:18-19; Acts 10:34; Rom 14:10)
 - **2. Justice is not <u>completely realized</u> in this life.** (Acts 17:31; Rom 2:16; 1 Cor 4:5)—the Day will come!
 - **a. Belief in God's justice requires faith.** Satan and world mock

- **b. Delayed punishment allows time for <u>repentance</u>.** (Rom 2:4; Heb 3:7)
- **B.** <u>He is All-Knowing.</u> (vs. 17-18, 28-29; Mat 12:36; Heb 4:13; 1 Jn 3:20)
 - 1. God knows and cares about all people—kings, common people
 - 2. Nothing is <u>hidden</u> from His sight.
- **C.** He is Merciful. (Ezek 18:23, 32; 33:11)
 - 1. God does not enjoy punishing the wicked.
 - 2. God provides opportunity to repent.
- **III.** THE MESSAGE OF REBUKE (vs. 17-20)
 - A. The Prophet of God (vs. 17, 20)—sent to confront sin
 - **B.** The Threat of Judgment (vs. 19-24)
 - 1. Prophecy (threat of punishment) is an <u>opportunity</u> to repent. (v. 27; 2 Kings 22:19; Jonah 3:4-10)
 - **2.** Those who <u>humble themselves</u> will receive mercy. (Ps 18:27; Pr 3:34; Is 66:2b; Joel 2:32; Jas 4:6, 10; 1 Pet 5:5-6)
 - **C.** Incomplete Repentance (v. 27)
 - 1. External submission but not internal change
 - 2. Fear of punishment but not love of God
 - **D.** <u>The Danger to Our Children</u> (vs. 21, 29; Ex 20:5-6; Joel 2:32/Acts 2:21)
 - 1. Our idolatry will affect our children.
 - 2. Our character will affect our children.
 - 3. We cannot pass on a sinless legacy; but we *can* pass on a heritage of <u>true worship</u> and <u>true repentance</u>.
