Wise Men Still Worship Him? - 12/20/20

TEXT- Matthew 2:1-12 Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judaea in the days of Herod the king, behold, there came wise men from the east to Jerusalem, 2 Saying, Where is he that is born King of the Jews? for we have seen his star in the east, and are come to worship him.

INTRO- People celebrate Christmas in different ways around the world. In Europe they have St. Nicolas day but Christmas day is primarily religious. In nations that have a strong number of Christians lights will be displayed and special food eaten and family time is provided. In non-Christian nations some are curious of Western celebration of Christmas and may have some form of it. In America special food may become a tradition. Lamb and pork, Ham or turkey are all prominent meats. Special pies, cookies and desserts are common. Decorations including evergreen trees are universal. Streets are lines with lights and decorations.

Americans celebrate in different ways. Having children for Christmas is a special treat. Some live alone, in the hospital, nursing home, prison widowed or divorced. Some live overseas in the military or on the mission field. Some are too poor to afford present and special meals.

In all of these traditions the reason for Christmas can be secondary or lost completely.

I have memories of Christmas in the hospital at home and at my grandparents. My best presents came when I was in the hospital: A pair of black motorcycle boots and a transistorized radio made in Japan. Sometimes people travel a long distance for Christmas. I think we One of the amazing stories surrounding the celebration of Christmas relates to a group of men who traveled anywhere from 800 to 1,000 miles over desert terrain. We know them as the Wise Men.

These men (Not sure how many) probably came from Babylon: Men who had become believers when Israel was in captivity.

According to the text, their purpose was to follow 'His star' to lead them to worship 'the King of the Jews' Matthew 2:2.

He was the Christ child, the promised Messiah who would take away the sin of the world (John 1:29), the One worthy of worship.

"When the Wise Men arrived, they fell down before the Christ child and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh Mat. 2:10-11.

- Gold reminds us of His royalty (fit for a King),
- Frankincense reminds us of His divinity (used for worship), high-quality incense used by a priest
- Myrrh reminds us of His destiny (used for burial). Prophet

How many wise men were there? We don't know
Was Jesus crucified on top of Mt. Calvary? Probably not
Did the angels announce the birth of Christ form the sky? Maybe form near the shepherd on the ground.

I. Why Did These Magi Come To Worship Jesus?

A. They were Old Testament Believers

Probably believed the witness of the captives and passed on the the following generations.

B. They were aware of the significance of the star

Perhaps they were given a revelation concerning the Lord's coming related to a star. From Jerusalem the star led them to the house where Jesus was staying.

C. They came a long distance at great expense

D. The purpose of their visit was to worship Jesus the Messiah

Jer 31:15 Thus saith the LORD; A voice was heard in Ramah, lamentation, and bitter weeping; Rahel weeping for her children refused to be comforted for her children, because they were not.
