WLC Q. 62. What is the visible Church? A. The visible Church is a society made up of all such as in all ages and places of the world do profess the true religion, and of their children. **WLC Q. 63.** What are the special privileges of the visible Church? A. The visible Church hath the privilege of being under God's special care and government; of being protected and preserved in all ages, notwithstanding the opposition of all enemies; and of enjoying the communion of saints, the ordinary means of salvation, and offers of grace by Christ to all the members of it in the ministry of the gospel, testifying, that whosoever believes in him shall be saved, and excluding none that will come unto him. **WLC Q. 64.** What is the invisible Church? A. The invisible Church is the whole number of the elect, that have been, are, or shall be gathered into one under Christ the head. **WLC Q. 65.** What special benefits do the members of the invisible Church enjoy by Christ? A. The members of the invisible Church, by Christ, enjoy union and communion with him in grace and glory.

WCF Chapter 25. Of the Church, 1. The catholic or universal Church, which is invisible, consists of the whole number of the elect, that have been, are, or shall be gathered into one, under Christ the Head thereof; and is the spouse, the body, the fullness of Him that filleth all in all. 2. The visible Church, which is also catholic or universal under the Gospel (not confined to one nation, as before under the law), consists of all those throughout the world that profess the true religion; and of their children: and is the kingdom of the Lord Jesus Christ, the house and family of God, out of which there is no ordinary possibility of salvation. 3. Unto this catholic visible Church Christ hath given the ministry, oracles, and ordinances of God, for the gathering and perfecting of the saints, in this life, to the end of the world: and doth, by His own presence and Spirit, according to His promise, make them effectual thereunto.
