### A Sure and Effectual Savior

ith the uncertainties of life, this one thing is sure. The LORD Jesus Christ took away the sins of His people in His death on the cross. "...but now once in the end of the world hath he appeared to put away sin by the sacrifice of himself." (Hebrews 9:26) That means that whatever legal binding it had upon the sinner for whom Christ died has now been annulled, as in a debt written off- PAID IN FULL!

It is not conceivable in God's high court that Christ should die for some who, in turn, will have to answer even for one sin. The apostle John wrote, "My little children, these things write I unto you, that ye sin not. And if any man sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous..." (1 John 2:1) Would you make God an unjust judge in first punishing His Son for someone's sins and then turning again to punish that sinner? The LORD Jesus Christ was appointed to bear the sins of many, not everyone, Hebrews 9:28. Although He was God Himself, He came into the world as a man and took upon Himself the form of a servant and bore those sins, not merely in sorrow but in death itself, even the death of the cross! [Philippians 2:7-10] He paid the ransom for His people and God's justice is satisfied, therefore His people are justified in Him! As the hymn writer expressed it:

"Yea, justified, O blessed thought; And sanctified, salvation wrought.

Thy blood hath pardon bought for me, And now I am complete in Thee!"

Justification then is the sinner's acceptance by God having been declared righteous by Christ's punishment on the cross as Substitute. Justification is uniquely by the effectual sacrifice of the LORD Jesus. Every sinner for whom He died was fully and freely justified when He died, Romans 4:25. His resurrection from the grave is proof that God the Father had forever justified those for whom Christ died. What a Gloriously Effectual Savior those sinners for whom He died have in Him!

## Justification Full, Free and Complete

n Romans 4:25 the phrase "for our justification" is literally: 'because of our justification' (parallel to the preceding clause: "for our trespasses" i.e., because of trespasses committed) and means <u>not</u> with a view to our justification but because all that was necessary on God's part for our justification had been effected in the death of Christ. On this account, He was raised from the dead. The Propitiation being perfect and complete, His resurrection was the confirmatory counterpart. In <u>5:18</u>, "justification of life" means 'justification which results in life' (cp. <u>ver. 21</u>). That God justifies the believing sinner by Christ's death involves [results in] His free gift of life.

## "Come unto Me." (Isaiah 55:1-5)

t is God's decree and purpose that all those whom He has chosen in Christ will without fail come to Him by faith; that He has freely given and that they will persevere in His grace unto endless glory to forever be in His presence. All the elect, without fail, will hear His Voice and obey His gracious summons and loving command to bow and worship before Him in humble submission and admiration. There are no 'ifs' or 'maybes' concerning God's purpose of grace in Christ Jesus our LORD. Neither is there any condition prefixed to His call in electing grace "Come unto me". All that God the Father required and demanded of His people has been answered and fulfilled in Christ, our Substitute. So, when He effectually calls, they come!

There is no obstacle or barrier to prevent those He calls from coming to Him, not even sin because Christ has redeemed us from the curse of the law, being made a curse for us and justified us before the Father by His shed blood at the cross. Therefore, we have no sin to condemn us! In Him we are complete! No sin..., declared righteous..., accepted and glorified in Christ, <u>Ephesians 1:6</u>.
