

"Loyalty" Who's # 1 Deuteronomy 13:1-11

Choosing the Lord over:

I. False Prophets –"that prophet…be put to death" (vs. 1-5)

There is an ability to:

- A. Impress "the sign or the wonder come to pass"
- B. Incite "saying, Let us go after other gods"
- C. Infect "So shall thou put the evil away from the midst of thee"

II. F amily & F riends – "thy friend…as thy own soul" (vs. 6-9) There is a temptation to:

- A. Consent "Thou shall not consent unto him"
- **B.** Consider "nor hearken unto him"
- C. Conceal "neither shall thou conceal him"

III. Feelings — "to thrust thee away from the Lord" (vs.10-11) There can be no:

- A. Sympathy "neither shall thy eye pity him"
- B. Sputtering -"you shall surely kill him, your hand shall be first"
- C. Secrecy "All Israel shall hear, and fear"
