When It Seems Like God Doesn't Care Habakkuk 1:2-4

Main Point:

There are many evils in life and God may not seem to care, but always remain firm in your commitment to prayer.

1. You are confronted with many evils in life.

2. These evils are likely troubling to you personally.

3. They may even seem to be ignored or tolerated by God.

4. Nevertheless, always remain firm in your commitment to prayer.
