- **B.** Permission "Let me pass through thy land"
- C. Payment "Thou shalt sell me meat for money"
- II. Lord "The Lord thy God hardened his spirit" (vs. 31-36)

  Supplying:
  - A. Prompts "And the Lord said...begin to possess"
  - **B.** Provision "The Lord our God delivered him before us"
  - C. Power "was not one city that was too strong for us"
- III. Limits "nor unto the cities in the mountains" (v. 37)

  Specifying:
- A. Peoples "the land of the children of Ammon thou came not"
- B. Places "nor unto any place of the river Jabbok"
- C. Precautions "the Lord our God forbad us"
