Touching the Future
Titus 2:4-10

Training young people to:

I. Study – “That they may teach” (vs. 4-5)

Study that includes:

- A. Mindset** – “teach the young women to be sober”
- B. Manner** – “to love their husbands, to love their children”
- C. Motivation** - “that the Word of God be not blasphemed”

II. Speak – “sound speech” (vs. 6-8)

Speech that is:

- A. Self-Controlled** - “to be sober minded”
- B. Sincere** – “showing uncorruptness, gravity, sincerity”
- C. Scriptural** – “that cannot be condemned”

III. Serve – “exhort servants to be obedient” (vs. 9-10)

Service that is:

- A. Responsive** – “obedient to their own masters to please them well”
- B. Respectful** – “please them well... not answering again”
- C. Reliable** – “shewing all good fidelity”
