In the Beginning Was the Word John 1:1-5 Reading: Genesis 1:1-5

...*pray*...

"In the beginning..."

Do you *recognize* that expression?

Can you tell me where it's *found*...? (Careful!)

Gen 1:1 – *In the beginning God...* **John 1:1** – *In the beginning was the Word.*

Gen 1:1 – *In the beginning God created*... **John 1:1 & 3** – *In the beginning was the Word*...*and all things came into being through Him.*

One more expression, for now: And the Word was God.

Turn w/me to John 1:1-18. John's Prologue (Into). Today: vv.1-5.

In case you *missed* John's *very first point* in his book, let me make a *compelling connection*:

John 1:1 – *The Word* – do you know who *He* is? He's God – but John wants you to see that there's *way more to it* than that!

John 1:14 – *The Word …became flesh. When* did that happen? In a *womb* of a of a young, Jewish virgin! Now John tells us *why…*

Three enormous truths about Jesus of Nazareth, the incarnate Word of God.

- 1. The Truth about the **Word & Eternity** (vv.1-2).
- 2. The Truth about the **Word & Creation** (vv.3).
- 3. The Truth about the **Word & World** (vv.4-5).

The Word from *Eternity* (vv. 1-2).

- John isn't subtle! He begins by taking out his Bible-sledgehammer and smacking you right between the eyes! (Say v.1) – In the beginning was the Word... Wham! (pause)
- 2. Let's start by identifying 2 *keywords*: the term "*Word*" & the verb "*was*."
 - a. The term *word* (Gr. λογος). → Only *John* uses this title for *Christ*: i.) 3x here in v.1; ii.) then (*huge*) v. 14; iii.) also in 1 Jn 1:1 & Rev 19:13.
 - i. The concept of "*the Word*" was rich in meaning to every reader in John's **1**st century audience: to *Greeks & Jews*.
 - ii. To the *Greek philosophers* the "Word" captured the idea of *creative force* & *cosmic intelligence*. But the Greeks **never** pictured *the Word* as a personality or a *man*...
 - iii. To the *Jews* the *Word* of the Lord (**OT**) expressed YHWH's power & His wisdom.
 - iv. V.1: The Word...the Word...the Word! What does John teach that the Word the power of God & the wisdom of God was...that it still is? (pause)
 - b. And then there's the verb *was*. Little *packages* can be *stuffed* with *dynamite*!
 - i. "Was" (Gr = $\varepsilon_1\mu_1$). It simply refers to *existence*. *Existence* w/o reference *beginning* or *end*.
 - ii. Since "was" (ειμι) is a verb, it has to have a *tense*. John carefully selects the Greek *imperfect* verb tense. *Imperfect* tense verbs suggest *repeated* or *customary* or *habitual* action.
 - iii. John is telling you, that without reference to *beginning* or to *end*, the Word *always was*.

- 3. Can John be saying that Jesus, the *Word*, is God? *Absolutely*! In fact, John immediately makes 3 *claims* that Jesus the Word has *always* been fully God. That the Word is *eternal* & *distinct* & fully *divine*.
 - a. Jesus, the Word, is eternal. In the beginning was the Word.
 One of my Greek Geeks translates v.1 like this: When the beginning began, the Word was already there! (2X)
 - b. Jesus, *the Word*, is *distinct*. And the Word was *with* God.
 John's Greek is much *richer* than our English. The picture here is *face to face*. Since before time began, *the Word* lived in *face to face* fellowship w/ God. And to *face* God (*fellowship* w/ Him) means the Word is a *person* in His own rights. *Distinct*.
 - c. Yet Jesus, *the Word*, is also clearly identity *as* God. *And the Word was God. Fully* God, in *all* His *essence*.
 - i. Some *cults* (spec. **JW**) misconstrue the *Greek grammar* under this text to claim that Jesus is *like* God, or is a *lesser god*. They simply (*fatally*) get the Greek *wrong*!
 - **ii.** John says it about the only way he could in **four** *compact* but *potent* words. This might be the *clearest* statement of Christ's *deity* in your entire Bible: *the Word was God*.
- 4. Then John takes back out his *Gospel-sledgehammer* and *hits you* again! Vs. 2 simply distills & repeats what John just said. (That means it's a *crucial truth*). <u>Read v.2</u>. → Three key truths about Jesus the Word:
 - a. *He already was, when the beginning began.*
 - b. *He was in fellowship with God.*
 - c. Therefore (you have to conclude) He is God.
- 5. **VV. 1&2** *boil down* to the most *important truth* in the story of *Jesus Christ.* He is *God.* If you *won't* **believe** this, you *can't* be a *Christian.*

<u>First</u> truth – the Word has always been: eternal, distinct, ... divine.

The Word at *Creation* (v. 3).

- 1. We make a pretty *big deal* in **v. 1** about the Word *always existing* **before** Creation (*in the beginning*). But that's not *all* John has to say on the topic of *Christ & Creation*.
- 2. John makes the same point *twice* (3). He makes it in the *positive*, then *immediately* <u>underlines his idea</u> by making it again in the *negative*:
 - a. Positive: All things came into being thru Him.
 - *b.* Negative; *Apart from Him nothing came into being that has come into being.*
 - *c.* John's contrast is *terse* & *arresting*: all things & nothing; thru Him & apart from Him. → All things through Him. Nothing apart from Him!
- I want to circle that expression *came into being*. It shows up 3x in v.3. This translates John's second verb about *existing*!
 - a. This Greek verb is γινομαι begat; become; be created.
 - b. In **vv.1-2**, we *bore down* on John's claim that the Word has *always existed* (**w/o** *beginning* or *end*). That verb was ειμι.
 - c. Now he *changes-up* his vocabulary to tell us that the Word *created* His world. That Christ made *everything*, **w/o** *exception*, that has ever *come to be*.

- 4. You see what *that* means, *don't you*? If the Word *made it all*, then of course, the Word is *God*.
 - a. After all, the Bible is *clear* this was all *created* by *God*. Gen 1:1 *In the beginning*...*God created the heavens* & *the earth*.
 - b. Beyond that, if *everything* was created *through* the *Word*, then the *Word* Himself was *not created*. Why? Because he had to already exist, before the very first thing was *brought into existence*. 2X
- 5. Beloved, *John* makes this point, *Paul* makes this point, & so does the writer of *Hebrews*.
 - **a.** Col 1:16 For by [God's beloved Son] all things were created, both in the heavens and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities – all things have been created thru Him & for Him. He is before all things, and in Him all things hold together!
 - **b.** Heb. 1:2 In these last days [God] has spoken to us in His Son, whom He appointed heir of all things, through whom also He made the world!

<u>First</u> truth – the Word has always been: eternal, distinct, ... divine.

Second truth: the Word created every single thing, w/o exception!

The Word came into our *World* (read vv. 4&5)

- 1. The concepts of *life & light* are **two** very important ideas in John's *Gospel &* other writings. And along with those ideas are the contrasts of *death & darkness*.
 - a. **John** will say over & over, because **Jesus** will say over & over, that Christ is *life* & *light*.
- 2. When John writes in **v.4** that the *Word* has *life* in Himself, what does he mean?
 - a. First, the apostle uses an *underlying Greek term* he often uses to describe *spiritual* life, specifically, ...
 - b. John says this life *was always* (ειμι; 1&2) in the Word *In Him was life*! This is much more *stunning* than it might first sound.
 - i. *All* living things are *given* life. Life is *created*, *breathed into*, *formed*, *given*, *summoned*, *conceived*, *begat*. *All* things are *given* life (*become*) *all* but **One**!
 - ii. God simply *has* life. Has *always* had life. No one *gave* it to Him no one *made* God. A theologian would say that God is *self-existent* and *eternal*.
 - iii. Now John is saying that the Word simply has always had life (self-existent & eternal). Do you see John's point? Only God has life in Himself. But the Word has life in Himself! Get the point...!?! The Word is...?
 - iv. The apostle just can't get over this the Word isGod...therefore, our Savior (Bethlehem's baby) is God in the flesh!

- 3. (**Re-read v.4.**) *Light* is John's 2nd big word, and you see it a lot in your *Bible*. *Light* in Scriptures suggests at least these 2 important ideas: *truth & holiness*.
 - God is *truth;* Christ is *truth* "*the way & the truth & the life!*"
 - God is *holy*; the **Word** is *holy* "*tempted in all things as we are, yet w/o sin.*"
 - a. Light also reminds us of its polar opposite... darkness.
 - b. John says the *Light* of the Word *shines* in the *darkness*. John *loves* the contrast! *Darkness* is **not** darkness like a cave w/o lights or midnight on overcast evening; *darkness* is an entire *world system*: darkness is Satan's pervasive *rule & system* of *sinfulness & evil*. Hey, this idea affects *you*...here's *how*:
 - i. All men & women are born as *slave-citizens* of the *Kingdom of Darkness*. They *stumble* & *grope* in spiritual darkness, & darkness molds their daily lives.
 - *c*. **Read v.5.** If your **NT** says *did not comprehend*...it would be *better* translated *did not overpower it*. The Ruler of *darkness* resists the *liberating invasion of Light*!
 - d. The Bible documents Satan's repeated attempts to extinguish the Life & Light of Christ. Satan tried to destroy Israel, then tried to destroy Israel's line of kings (Christ would be born from Israel & her kings). Evil King Herod killed every baby in Bethlehem (but Baby Jesus was gone!). Satan tempted Jesus to abandon His mission w/ those wilderness temptations. He then planted a traitor (Judas) among Jesus' closest friends. The Enemy thought he'd finally pulled it off on the Cross!
 - e. But here (5.b) is John's *preview* of *Golgotha*, & the *Resurrection* that followed on Day 3. Here is the *victory* of the Word, who is *Life & Light*: *The Light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overpower it!*

Beloved, rejoice! The third truth: Word has come into our world!

It isn't just Satan who hates the Light!

Until the Word gives us *life*, **we** won't love His *light* – we'll *hide* from it! We'll choose *slavery in darkness* over *liberty* in His *light*! *Every time*!

Here's how Jesus explained that in **John 3:19** – "*This is the judgment, that the Light has come into the world, and men loved the darkness rather than the Light, for their deeds were evil.*"

Do you think that's **not** *true*...?

Apart from Christ, we (each & every one of us!) live *selfishly* & *proudly*.

We lie. We lust. We covet. We steal. We scoff at truth.

We refuse to *honor God*. We take His name in *vain*. We worship *our way* – or *no way* at all.

Apart from Christ – **you** *love darkness*. What can you *do*?

Friend, the *Life of God* in the *Light of Christ* came into the world **2000** years ago to *shine in darkness*. He **still** *shines*!

Will you put away your evil deeds & come to the Truth & the Light?

Trust Christ to *forgive* you & *free* you. Why not start the New Year by **receiving** God's *gift of life*!

...*pray*...
