Westminster Larger Catechism

Q. 196 What does the conclusion of the
Lord's Prayer teach us?

A. The conclusion of the Lord's Prayer (which is, "For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen."), teaches us to enforce our petitions with arguments, which are to be taken, not from any worthiness in ourselves, or in any other creature, but from God;

**and with our prayers
to join praises, ascribing to God alone
eternal sovereignty, omnipotency,
and glorious excellency; in regard
whereof, as He is able and willing to
help us, so we by faith are emboldened
to plead with Him that He
would, and quietly to rely upon Him,
that He will fulfill our requests.**

**And, to testify this our desire and
assurance, we say, “Amen.”**

**THE ADMINISTRATION OF
THE LORD'S SUPPER**

What is the Lord's Supper?

The Lord's Supper is a sacrament, in which by giving and receiving bread and wine, according to Christ's direction, His death is shown forth; and the worthy receivers are, not after a corporal and carnal manner, but by faith, made par-takers of His body and blood, with all His benefits, to their spiritual nourish-ment and growth in grace.

What is required to be worthy of receiving the Lord's Supper?

It is required of those who would receive the Lord's Supper worthily that they examine themselves, as to their knowledge to discern the Lord's body, as to their faith to feed on Him and as to their repentance, love, and obedience; lest, coming unworthily, they eat and drink judgment on themselves.
