CONCLUSION: Christ has joined us with Himself and with one another in a holy partnership. It is His doing for His purposes. He calls us into His Holy Family to partner with one another and this partnership involves our joyful sharing of all that He entrusts to our care. Blessings and sorrows. Abundance and need. It is the fruit that flows from our abiding in Christ. Not only are we required to share these things with one another, but we are bound to do so *joyfully* in Christ. Let us be a congregation, by His grace, who delights in one another because of His delight in us!

Second Corinthians 4:13-18

Since we have the same spirit of faith according to what has been written, "I believed, and so I spoke," we also believe, and so we also speak, knowing that he who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus and bring us with you into His presence. For it is all for your sake, so that as grace extends to more and more people it may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God. So we do not lose heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day. For this light momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal.

John 15:1-5

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in me that does not bear fruit he takes away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes, that it may bear more fruit. Already you are clean because of the word that I have spoken to you. Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing."

Romans 12:1-2

"I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a *living sacrifice*, holy and *acceptable to God*, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect."

Acts 2:42-47

"And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. And awe came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles. And all who believed were together and had all things in common. And they were selling their possessions and belongings and distributing the proceeds to all, as any had need. And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they received their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved."

Mark 7:9-13

And he said to them, "You have a fine way of rejecting the commandment of God in order to establish your tradition! For Moses said, 'Honor your father and your mother'; and, 'Whoever reviles father or mother must surely die.' But you say, 'If a man tells his father or his mother, "Whatever you would have gained from me is Corban" (that is, given to God)—then you no longer permit him to do anything for his father or mother, thus making void the word of God by your tradition that you have handed down."

Sunday Morning

READ Philippians 4:14-18; Second Corinthians 4:13-18; John 15:1-5; Romans 12:1-2; Acts 2:42-47; Mark 7:9-13; Psalm 104:31-35. DISCUSS How would you describe our partnership in Christ? How does your stewardship of your experiences and resources reflect this? How does Jesus delight you? MEDITATE on **Ephesians 2:4-7**. PRAY "Jesus, grow gospel fruit in us to rejoice in sharing all that You have entrusted to us together."

Sunday Evening

Monday

READ Philippians 4:14-18; Second Corinthians 4:13-18; John 15:1-5. DISCUSS How is His grace abounding in us together? How do we view our circumstances according to God's goodness? SERVE by putting someone else's interests *above your own*! MEDITATE on **Ephesians 2:4-7**. PRAY, "Lord, use whatever You will to conform us to Christ. Empower us to rejoice in that good work."

Tuesday

READ **Philippians 4:14-18**; **John 15:1-5**; **Romans 12:1-2**. DISCUSS What does it mean to abide in Christ as the true vine? Which false vines are you (we) tempted to abide in? How can we fix our eyes on Him? SERVE by considering someone else's needs *above your own*! MEDITATE on **Ephesians 2:4-7**. PRAY, "Jesus, we want to abide in You alone. We want to obey you joyfully. We long to love our brothers and sisters generously by faith in You. Make it so in us together we pray."

Wednesday

READ **Philippians 4:14-18**; **Romans 12:1-2**; **Acts 2:42-47**. DISCUSS What living sacrifices are you (we) offering Christ? How does His sacrifice once for all free us to offer these living sacrifices joyfully? How do you need to repent from joyless sacrifice? SERVE by *caring about someone else* more than yourself! MEDITATE on **Ephesians 2:4-7**. PRAY, "Lord, make our hearts overflow with delight for You expressed through love for one another."

Thursday

READ **Philippians 4:14-18**; **Acts 2:42-47**; **Mark 7:9-13**. DISCUSS Why does money seem to mess everything up? How are you expressing faith in Christ through acts of love in giving and receiving? How does faith in Christ liberate us from our love for money? MEDITATE on **Ephesians 2:4-7**. PRAY, "Lord, You give us all that we have. Teach us to joyfully steward our experiences and resources by faith in You."

Friday

READ Philippians 4:14-18; Second Corinthians 4:13-18; John 15:1-5; Romans 12:1-2; Acts 2:42-47; Mark 7:9-13; Psalm 104:31-35. DISCUSS, What have you been learning from these passages? How has God been distressing and encouraging you in His Word this week? What do you need to change as a result? MEDITATE on **Ephesians 2:4-7**. PRAY that we at FCCW would *honor Christ in all that we think, say, and do*.

Saturday

PREPARE today for the service tomorrow. READ **Philippians 4:1-23**. Invite others to join you tomorrow for Sunday School at 9:00 and the service @ 10:30. Ask Jesus to gather us together to praise Him joyfully.

Ephesians 2:4-7

"But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved—and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, so that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus."
