CONCLUSION: We could reproduce with a whole lot less mess and fewer complications, but God designed sex not only for us to produce offspring, but so that we might enjoy one another. The intimacy for husband and wife to delight in together is His idea. As its Designer, God knows it can be as destructive as it can be beautiful, and so He has given it to us for our pleasure in a very limited context—exclusive matrimony. Unfortunately, we have treated His good gifts with contempt, thinking we know better. Thankfully, Christ has not left us in our brokenness, but has redeemed us from even our whoredom and infidelity. Let us honor marriage and encourage one another to guard the marriage bed as we should!

Westminster Larger Catechism

Q. 138. What are the duties required in the seventh commandment?

A. The *duties required* in the seventh commandment are, chastity in body, mind, affections, words, and behavior; and the preservation of it in ourselves and others; watchfulness over the eyes and all the senses; temperance, keeping of chaste company, modesty in apparel; marriage by those that have not the gift of continency, conjugal love, and cohabitation; diligent labor in all our callings; shunning all occasions of uncleanness, and resisting temptations thereunto.

Q. 139. What are the sins forbidden in the seventh commandment?

A. The *sins forbidden* in the seventh commandment, besides the neglect of the duties required, are, adultery, fornication, rape, incest, sodomy, and all unnatural lusts; all unclean imaginations, thoughts, purposes, and affections; all corrupt or filthy communications, or listening thereunto; wanton looks; impudent or light behavior; immodest apparel; prohibiting of lawful, and dispensing with unlawful marriages; allowing, tolerating, keeping of stews, and resorting to them; entangling vows of single life; undue delay of marriage; having more wives or husbands than one at the same time; unjust divorce or desertion; idleness, gluttony, drunkenness, unchaste company; lascivious songs, books, pictures, dancing, stage plays; all other provocations to, or acts of uncleanness, either in ourselves or others.

READ Exodus 20:14; Hosea 2-4; Ephesians 5:1-33; Psalm 119:81-96. DISCUSS How do all other relationships relate to the husband/wife foundation? Who submits to whom? How? MEDITATE on **First Corinthians 6:18-20** with WLC #138-9. PRAY, "Faithful Father, Thank You for giving us families and showing us Your love."

READ Exodus 20:13; Hosea 4-9; First Thessalonians 4:1-8; Psalm 119:81-96. DISCUSS How are we to walk in holiness? For what is your body set apart? To what has God called us? MEDITATE on First Corinthians 6:18-20 with WLC #138-9. PRAY, "Faithful Father, Thank You for calling us in holiness!"

Thursday

READ Exodus 20:12; Hosea 10-14; Leviticus 18:1-6; Hebrews 13:4; Psalm 119:81-96. DISCUSS What similarities do you see between Exodus 20 and Leviticus 18? What is the basis for our holy living? SERVE by putting someone else's interests *above your own*! MEDITATE on First Corinthians 6:18-20 with WLC #138-9. PRAY, "Faithful Father, forgive us for our infidelity."

Friday

READ Exodus 20:14; First Corinthians 6:18-20; 7:1-5; Hosea 1-14; Ephesians 5:1-33; First Thessalonians 4:1-8; Leviticus 18:1-6; Psalm 94:1-3; 119:81-96. DISCUSS What has God been teaching you this week? SERVE by *caring for someone in need!* MEDITATE on First Corinthians 6:18-20 with WLC #138-9. PRAY that we at FCCW would honor Christ together.
