

I. Our problem: Our unrighteousness condemns us.

II. Christ's work: He earned a perfect righteousness.

LARGER CATECHISM Q. 71: How is justification an act of God's free grace?

A. Although Christ, by his obedience and death, did make a proper, real, and full satisfaction to God's justice in the behalf of them that are justified; yet in as much as God accepteth the satisfaction from a surety, which he might have demanded of them, and did provide this surety, his own only Son, imputing <u>his righteousness</u> to them, and requiring nothing of them for their justification but faith, which also is his gift, their justification is to them of free grace.

II.	The serenity of God's throne.
III.	The sanctity of the saints.

LARGER CATECHISM Q. 45: How doth Christ execute the office of a king?

A. Christ executeth the office of a king, in calling out of the world a people to himself, and giving them officers, laws, and censures, by which he visibly governs them; in bestowing saving grace upon his elect, rewarding their obedience, and correcting them for their sins, preserving and supporting them under all their temptations and sufferings, restraining and overcoming all their enemies, and powerfully ordering, all things for his own glory, and their good; and also in taking vengeance on the rest, who know not God, and obey not the gospel.
