Follow-Up Questions

- 1. Read Romans 10:8-13 and then re-read Psalm 16:1-2.
 - a. How does David set an example of faith to the New Testament believer?
 - b. What is the difference between "making" Jesus our Lord and "acknowledging" Jesus as our Lord? Which have you done?
 - c. Have you truly surrendered yourself totally to Him?
- 2. Consider the life of Jesus. When you read the Gospels, He was constantly doing something incredibly important in between and in the midst of His teaching and miracles. Read Luke 5:16; 6:12; and 9:18 for examples.
 - a. Re-read Psalm 16:8. What do the words of David and the example of Jesus indicate are a good practice regarding our contemplation of God?
 - b. Is the Lord "always before you?" How would this keep you from being made to stumble?
- 3. Read Acts 2:22-36 and 13:26-41.
 - a. How do Peter and Paul give new meaning to Psalm 16?
 - b. How does applying Christ to the entire Psalm give new insight to each verse? (Hint: Consider Christ as the author of this Psalm by the Holy Spirit.)
