I. His resolve II. His Prayer

I. His Resolve

- A. David's resolve is spoken in face of many other voices (vs. 9-10)
 - 1. Not clear when/who/what but they are wicked (vs. 4-6)
 - 2. Upright are not exempt from enemies without and fears within
- B. David's resolve: vs. 7a
 - 1. **As for me:** He decidedly turns to God instead of solving his own problem
 - 2. I will come: I will approach Him, in His house, facing toward holy temple
 - 3. **in thy fear:** with utmost reverence about coming to and before God

II His Prayer

- A. Lead me, O LORD, in thy righteousness
 - 1. David's enemies question his righteousness and the upright amen that
 - 2. Though uncomfortable, is God's way to teach us David's prayer
- B. Lead me and ... make thy way straight (make level, plain) before my face
 - 1. This cry is fitting at all times and in all situations (Ps. 25:5)
 - 2. Yet notice he prayed make thy way straight before my face
