Theme: The calling of Christ's under-shepherds is filled with great challenges, warnings and rewards. The flock under their oversight will be secure and strong, or weak and wandering, as a result of the care they receive, and their own response to it.

Introduction/Background: The consistent picture of "leadership" for the people of God is that of a "shepherd". Moses (Isaiah 63:11) – David (2 Samuel 5:2) - Jesus (John 10:11)

Acts 20:28 (from last week) picks up that image and calling.

I. The Task of the Shepherd

 - b. Don't know the sheep who is weak, who is strong.

- B. Good Shepherds??
 - 1. Shepherd the Flock! (1 Peter 5:2)
 - a. Acts 20:28ff Instruct Correct Protect Train
 - b. The other side of Ezekiel 34
 - 1) They Feed themselves so they are well fit for service
 - 2) *They know the sheep!* who is weak, who is strong.
 - 3) They are in the middle of the lives of the Sheep!
 - 4) Seeking the lost!!
 - 2. Heart/Demeanor of the Elder? 1 Peter 5:2-3
 - Serving Willingly

- In sacrifice!

II. The Task of the Sheep

- A. Joyful, grateful submission to:
 - authority
 - oversight
 - direction, instruction
- B. Open and Honest
 - Not hiding from the shepherds nor hiding "things" from them
- C. Respect the office
 - Speaking with respect (1 Timothy 5:19)

III. Elders – Now and When

- A. Your Elders and Deacons
 - Pray for the elders (and other leaders)
 - Open your hearts/lives to them
- B. Raising up the Elders of the Future
 - Aspire to lead/shepherd

IV. The Chief Shepherd's Promise

- Those who serve well will receive the crown. (1 Peter 5:4)
- The Great Shepherd will *keep* His sheep safe and secure. (John 10:28ff)
