Readings from Matthew chapter 8—November 8th-14th, 2020

¹⁸ And when Jesus saw great multitudes about Him, He gave a command to depart to the other side. ¹⁹ Then a certain scribe came and said to Him, "Teacher, I will follow You wherever You go." ²⁰ And Jesus said to him, "Foxes have holes and birds of the air *have* nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay *His* head." ²¹ Then another of His disciples said to Him, "Lord, let me first go and bury my father." ²² But Jesus said to him, "Follow Me, and let the dead bury their own dead." ²³ Now when He got into a boat, His disciples followed Him. ²⁴ And suddenly a great tempest arose on the sea, so that the boat was covered with the waves. But He was asleep. ²⁵ Then His disciples came to *Him* and awoke Him, saying, "Lord, save us! We are perishing!" ²⁶ But He said to them, "Why are you fearful, O you of little faith?" Then He arose and rebuked the winds and the sea, and there was a great calm. ²⁷ So the men marveled, saying, "Who can this be, that even the winds and the sea obey Him?"

<u>Sunday:</u> Who is the Son of Man? Pray that Atlanta (Ga.) RPC would continue to grow in knowledge and in love. Pray for the raising up of elders at McKinnon (Australia) RPC.

<u>Monday:</u> What does v. 20 tell us about the humility of Jesus? Read Philippians 2:5-8. Tim McCracken's prison ministry. Pray for the Girls Group at Airdrie (Scotland) RPC, resuming online this Friday.

<u>Wednesday:</u> In Scripture, what is symbolized by the raging of the sea? Read Isaiah 57:20-21. Give thanks that First (Cambridge, Mass.) RPC's midweek meetings continue online and that some members have been able to gather for worship; pray that all would be able to gather in person soon.

<u>Thursday:</u> Why did Jesus say that His disciples were men of little faith? How big or small is your faith? Pray for the police officers' Bible study that takes place in Marion (Ind.) RPC's building.

<u>Friday:</u> How does Jesus prove that He is God? Pray for the elders at Providence RPC (Pittsburgh, Pa.) to have wisdom and discernment in overseeing the flock.

<u>Saturday:</u> Read Mark 4:35-41. Of what were Jesus' disciples more fearful—the storm on the sea, or Jesus? Pray that God would bless the efforts by College Hill RPC (Beaver Falls, Pa.) in student discipleship with their new group of students this
