Theme: The temple was built as a sign of God's presence among his people. At the entrance stood two stunning reminders of God's promises and his power for those who walk before him. A faithful king, relying on God's word and strength, would be the key to God's dwelling among his people.

Background: A land and a people are established in peace! Building of the temple can proceed.

Introduction: My love/hate relationships with building projects.

NOTE: Keep two thoughts in mind as we look at these chapters:

- 1. The temple and Solomon's palace are signs of God's blessing and presence
- 2. The Lord has chosen to rule his people through a human king

I. God Prepares the Way (Chapter 5)

- A. Peace in the land
 - 1. David, man of war
 - 2. Solomon is established in peace (cf. 1 Kings 4:20,21,24b,25)
 - Wisdom leads to peace (and order)
 - 3. Pursuing what was promised (1 Kings 5:1-6; 2 Samuel 7:13)
 - 4. Foreshadowing the kingdom of God
- B. The nations come
 - 1. Hiram's delegation (5:1)
 - 2. Solomon recounts God's promise (5:4,5)
 - 3. Hiram blesses the Lord (5:7)

NOTE: Unbelievers can recognize blessings that the people of God enjoy (cf. Isaiah 60:3; Genesis 22:18)

4. Providing supplies and labor

II. The Foundation Is Laid (Chapter 6)

- A. An historic event monumental, actually
 - 1. Marking the day!
 - a. The Exodus after 430 years (to the day!)
 - Delivered from bondage (Exodus 12:40-41; Genesis 15:13)
 - b. The land at Rest 480 years later
 - Delivered from their enemies (1 Kings 6:1; 2 Samuel 7:10-11)

NOTE: God's plans don't always unfold quickly! But, rest assured, they will be fulfilled!

- 2. In reverence and awe (6:7)
 - -No construction noise

- B. To show forth His glory
 - 1. Construction begins In the fourth year! (6:37)
 - 2. Inside vs. outside
 - a. The things most people won't see? (cf. 6:21ff, esp.29,30)
 - Gold-covered everything
 - b. The extravagance of Worship!
 - There have been complaints (cf. Matthew 24:6-13)
 - Reflecting glory and *holiness*

NOTE: Temple represented God's presence on earth – which itself would one day be "holy to the Lord"

NOTE: How much of creation (and its beauty) remains "unseen" by human eyes?

- C. The true foundation (6:11-13)
 - 1. It's not about a building
 - It is not the stones
 - It's God's word!
 - 2. It's not about ritual (1 Samuel 15:22)
- D. The weight of leadership
 - 1. Message to the king!
 - Faithfulness (Leviticus 19:2)
 - 2. As the king goes, so go the people!!

NOTE: We aren't kings – but one man's wisdom, actions, directions – can have a monumental effect on a nation or a family.

III. The Finished Work (Chapter 7)

- A. A matter of emphasis
 - 1. Time difference (7 years vs. 13 years)
 - 2. Text difference (70 verses vs. 12 verses)
- B. Sharing in the beauty of holiness (Reflection of Glory)
- C. The two witnesses Jachin and Boaz
 - 1. Getting our attention
 - 2. Jachin "He will establish" or "May he establish"
 - Reminding the people of God's *Promise*
 - 3. Boaz "In him (Yhwh) is strength" of "By him (Yhwh) he is mighty"
 - Reminder of God's *Power* God Provides!

IV. Our Sure Foundation

- 1. The whole account looks forward to greater fulfillment.
- 2. The foundation of the temple (God's house, residence) isn't the stone and wood; it's God's Word and promise.
- 3. Our foundation isn't in our works but in God's living Word and promise.
