Call to Worship

God calls us to worship Him as He calls to our mind the distinction between the two facets of covenant sanctions and their result: how the righteous prosper and the wicked perish. We worship in part because He has ordered His universe thusly.

Psalm 112

- Praise the LORD!
- Blessed is the man who fears the LORD, who greatly delights in his commandments!
- ² His offspring will be mighty in the land; the generation of the upright will be blessed.
- ³ Wealth and riches are in his house, and his righteousness endures forever.
- ⁴ Light dawns in the darkness for the upright; he is gracious, merciful, and righteous.
- ⁵ It is well with the man who deals generously and lends; who conducts his affairs with justice.
- ⁶ For the righteous will never be moved; he will be remembered forever.
- ⁷ He is not afraid of bad news; his heart is firm, trusting in the LORD.
- ⁸ His heart is steady; he will not be afraid, until he looks in triumph on his adversaries.
- ⁹ He has distributed freely; he has given to the poor; his righteousness endures forever; his horn is exalted in honor.
- ¹⁰The wicked man sees it and is angry; he gnashes his teeth and melts away; the desire of the wicked will perish!

* Reading from the Law

Ruthlessness with respect to sin and its influence in our lives and around us is an essential component of godliness.

Deuteronomy 7:1-5 ESV

"When the LORD your God brings you into the land that you are entering to take possession of it, and clears away many nations before you, the Hittites, the Girgashites, the Amorites, the Canaanites, the Perizzites, the Hivites, and the Jebusites, seven nations more numerous and mightier than you, ² and when the LORD your God gives them over to you, and you defeat them, then you must devote them to complete

destruction. You shall make no covenant with them and show no mercy to them. ³ You shall not intermarry with them, giving your daughters to their sons or taking their daughters for your sons, ⁴ for they would turn away your sons from following me, to serve other gods. Then the anger of the LORD would be kindled against you, and he would destroy you quickly. ⁵ But thus shall you deal with them: you shall break down their altars and dash in pieces their pillars and chop down their Asherim and burn their carved images with fire.

¹¹ Beloved, I urge you as sojourners and exiles to abstain from the passions of the flesh, which wage war against your soul. ¹² Keep your conduct among the Gentiles honorable, so that when they speak against you as evildoers, they may see your good deeds and glorify God on the day of visitation.

Distribution of Elements

Because we believe that wine was used in the Last Supper and is thus more in accord with the fullness of symbolism intended by God in the Lord's Supper, we offer and encourage wine for those who take part in Communion. For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles.
