How Dare You?

1 Corinthians 6:1 (ESV)

When one of you has a grievance against another, does he dare go to law before the unrighteous instead of the saints?

- Context: church judges insiders, God will judge the world (5:12-13)
- "Dare" = emphatic first word in the Greek
- "Grievance" is pragma which means 'a lawsuit' in this context

Rhetorical Questions Convict Error

1 Corinthians 6:2 (ESV)

Or do you not know that the saints will judge the world? And if the world is to be judged by you, are you incompetent to try trivial cases?

- Eschatology is the key issue (Daniel 7:22)
- Ruling with Christ (Rev. 20:4; 2 Tim. 2:12a)
- This is a greater to lesser argument
- Their status rivalry is leading them astray

Greater to Lesser

1 Corinthians 6:3 (ESV)

Do you not know that we are to judge angels? How much more, then, matters pertaining to this life!

- They expected secular courts to adjudicate the mundane 'bio tikos' (see Luke 21:34)
- The details about "judge angels" are not specified but are definitely eschatological

A Difficult Translation Issue

1 Corinthians 6:4 (ESV)

So if you have such cases, why do you lay them before those who have no standing in the church?

1 Corinthians 6:4 (NIV)

Therefore, if you have disputes about such matters, appoint as judges even men of little account in the church!

- The Greek is either indicative or imperative
- Indicative implies ironic, imperative literal

A Shameful Situation

1 Corinthians 6:5-6 (ESV)

I say this to your shame. Can it be that there is no one among you wise enough to settle a dispute between the brothers, but brother goes to law against brother, and that before unbelievers?

- Their actions show lack of concern for God's promises or the body of Christ
- True honor comes from being part of God's family, not from getting our way!

Jeremiah 9:23-24 (ESV)

For in these things I delight, declares the LORD."
