# WORSHIP GUIDE

PREPARING FOR PUBLIC WORSHIP: PART 5 The Diet of the Christian: Singing

inging is no doubt a controversial topic. What should our singing do? What should we be singing? The answers are often derived from "I think," "I feel," or "I prefer." However, the Bible has a very different story to tell about our heart's desires, and natural tendencies:

- "The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately sick; who can understand it?" (Jer. 17:9)
- "So I gave them over to their stubborn hearts, to follow their own counsels. Oh, that my people would listen to me, that Israel would walk in my ways!" (Ps. 81:12-14)

We should not be so quick to "follow the heart" because of our natural tendency to deceive ourselves. Instead, we should turn to the Holy Spirit through his revealed Word for our direction, including for our singing: "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God" (Col. 3:16). One of the main methods of Christ dwelling within us is to fill our lives with the singing of the "Word of Christ." It should be in accordance with the Word of God both in content and in richness. We should strive to model the loveliness and robustness of Christ's Word and doctrine with our singing voices.

When we sing, we not only obey His command, but we are also building up one another (e.g. Col. 3:16). There is a joy in singing the same Word that can be brought to us every day (Ps. 5:11; 9:2; 51:14; 59:16). Indeed, the culmination of our lives will be on the final days, when an incalculable multitude will be singing the song of the Lamb (Rev. 7, 16).

By singing throughout the week, we also prepare our hearts for worship. We should strive, even in our darkest moments, to center around the Word, especially through singing. What a powerful tool to love the Lord and to be filled with his love. His joy is not containable, and when we drink deeply in his Word and doctrine, and do not carelessly sing, we not only submit to Christ, but we depend on him. Oh that we would find our rest in Him, a rest which cannot be shaken or taken from us.

Bless the Lord, O my soul; And all that is within me, bless His holy name! (Psalm 103:1)

## The Reading of the Law

Exodus 20:12; Deuteronomy 21:18-21, 27:16; Matthew 15:1-6 Honor your father and your mother, that your days may be long in the land that the Lord your God is giving you.

"If a man has a stubborn and rebellious son who will not obey the voice of his father or the voice of his mother, and, though they discipline him, will not listen to them, then his father and his mother shall take hold of him and bring him out to the elders of his city at the gate of the place where he lives, and they shall say to the elders of his city, "This our son is stubborn and rebellious; he will not obey our voice; he is a glutton and a drunkard." Then all the men of the city shall stone him to death with stones. So you shall purge the evil from your midst, and all Israel shall hear, and fear.

"Cursed be anyone who dishonors his father or his mother.' And all the people shall say, 'Amen.'

Then Pharisees and scribes came to Jesus from Jerusalem and said, "Why do your disciples break the tradition of the elders? For they do not wash their hands when they eat." He answered them, "And why do you break the commandment of God for the sake of your tradition? For God commanded, 'Honor your father and your mother,' and, 'Whoever reviles father or mother must surely die.' But you say, 'If anyone tells his father or his mother, "What you would have gained from me is given to God," he need not honor his father.' So for the sake of your tradition you have made void the word of God.
