1. How does God interact with people?

Read Luke 1:8-9; 1:26-27; 2:8-9 - discuss the following questions.

God appeared to Zechariah, Mary, and the shepherds in everyday circumstances. What does this imply about what it means to be “spiritual”?

What is significant about these three being the first to hear the Good News?

God chose these shepherds to be the first evangelists. Name other people in the Bible that are used in similar ways?

Why would God do this? (Provide a Bible verse if you can.)

2. How do we interact with God?

Read Psalm 145:8-9; Romans 8:18-21 and discuss the questions:

Of the attributes listed in Psalm 145:8-9, which one means the most to you? Why?

How does believing His promises help you find joy in a life full of trials?

What effect has the news of Christ’s birth had on you?

- b. spiritual commitment
- c. an awakened sense of joy
- d. hope for the future
- e. thankfulness for God’s forgiveness
- f. confusion about God’s plan

Describe how waiting on God and His promises can bring joy to a normal day.
