"Do Not Despise Prophecies" (Numbers 11:24–29)

b. What to Do: Embracing the Genuine and Rejecting the Evil (verses 21–22)

"But Test Everything" (Deut. 13:1–5; 18:15–22; 1 John 3:23–4:6; 1 Cor. 14:26–33)

"Hold Fast What Is Good" (Luke 8:15)

"Abstain from [or "Hold Away"] Every Form of Evil"

- II. The Ongoing Relevance of These Instructions
 - a. Don't outlaw the good in reaction to the bad.
 - b. Don't disdain the Spirit's work in reaction to the evil one's work.
 - c. Discern and decide whether spiritual messages are good or evil.
 - d. When God's Word speaks, receive the message.
