  - A. Calling requires believing (v. 14a).
  - B. Believing requires hearing (v. 14b).
  - C. Hearing requires a preacher (v. 14c).
  - D. Preachers require sending (v. 15).
  - E. The content of what must be heard and believed is the gospel of Jesus Christ (v. 17).
- II. Obedience is the fruit of rightly calling on the name of the Lord (v. 16).
- III. Israel has not rightly called on the name of the Lord.
  - A. The OT proves that they have heard (v. 18).
  - B. The OT testifies that they have understood.
    - 1. Witness #1 is Moses (v. 19).
    - 2. Witness #2 is Isaiah (v. 20).
  - C. Yet they have not obeyed, in spite of God's longsuffering (v. 21).
