Introduction

- I. Jesus Christ opens and closes the kingdom through the keys of the kingdom that He has given to the church (Matt. 16).
- II. The key of Christian discipline is neglected in the church world today and is under attack.

## The Key-Power of Christian Discipline

## i. Christ's Work

A. Christ works through this key to protect the church from the serious threats of false doctrine and sin that grows like a cancer in the church. This is what A, 85 speaks of.

B. Christian discipline is the work of Jesus Christ through the church (Rev. 2; Matt. 10:40)

## II. Faithfully Exercised

A. In Matt. 18:15 we are commanded, "Moreover if thy brother shall trespass against thee, go and tell him his fault between thee and him alone."

B. If the sinner persists in impenitence, refusing to confess and forsake his sin, you are called to tell it to the church – by this is mean the elders of the church.

## III. God's Declaration

- A. Those who continue to walk in sin are excluded from the church and from the kingdom of God.
- B. But to those who repent with a true repentance there is great joy angels rejoice in heaven over the repentance of a sinner.
