Titus 3:10-11 — "How to Handle the Divisive Person in Church!"

Satan always hates Christian fellowship; it is his policy to keep Christians apart. Anything which can divide saints from one another he delights in. He attaches far more importance to godly intercourse than we do. Since union is strength, he does his best to promote separation. (Charles Spurgeon)

God hates division and God hates the person who spreads strife among brothers (Prov 6.19).

Background to Titus 3:10-11

- •To maintain the truth of the gospel and the purity of the church, church leaders must deal properly and decisively with factious people.
- •In Paul's final words to Titus, he charges Titus as to: (1) what he should DO in v.8 (=preach), (2) what he must avoid (v.9) and now (3) how to handle factious/divisive people that creep into the assembly (v.10).

THESIS — From Titus 3.10-11 - God gives us very clear instructions on how to handle divisive people in the church.

The main point: we must carefully & quickly *reject* divisiveness & the divisive person (v.10-11)!

I. WHAT IS A DIVISIVE ONE? (10)

• The *danger* of the divisive one.

The **definition** of a "factious" person or a "divisive" person —

Beware of these kinds of divisive persons:

- 1. gospel-eclipsing man.
- 2. the critical man. (James 1.20-21)
- 3. The unteachable man (usually a twin to Diotrephes in 3 John 9-10)
- 4. the joy-robbing man
- 5. the time-wasting man
- 6. the non-attending man
- 7. the disgruntled-accusing man

II.HOW TO HANDLE A DIVISIVE ONE? (10b)

• The *discipline* of the divisive one.

Titus 3:10-11 — "How to Handle the Divisive Person in Church!"

A. The steps & the process & the format:

Warn him once.

Warn him twice.

Then reject him decisively.

"Because of potential harm to the sheep, church shepherds must take SWIFT AND FIRM ACTION with factious men (who are actually wolves in sheep's clothing), thus escalating their action beyond the slower, more methodical process outlined in Matthew 18:15-17 for other sins." (Paul Tautges)

Why take such quick & decisive action? Two primary reasons:

- (1) There's an immediate threat to the unity of the Church body; and
- (2) There's a sin which could bring great harm and shame to the name of Christ & His gospel in the community.

III.WHY TAKE ACTION WITH A DIVISIVE ONE? (11)

• The *deception/destructiveness* of the divisive one.

Why take action?? >> Because we know 3 things:

- 1. he is **perverted** —
- 2. he is **sinning** —
- 3. he is **self-condemned** —

5 REASONS WHY WE MUST DO CHURCH DISCIPLINE

- 1. For the Good of the Person Disciplined.
- 2. For the Good of the Other Christians, as They See the Danger of Sin.
- 3. For the Health of the Church as a Whole.
- 4. For the Corporate Witness of the Church
- 5. For the Glory of God, as We Reflect His Holiness.

See the clear parallel to Romans 16:17-18!

Some practical ways to repulse Satan's attacks to bring division in the body of Christ:

- Spend more time focusing on evidences of grace in others than you do pondering their sins & weaknesses & shortcomings.
- Consider that spiritual safety comes thru spiritual unity.
- Meditate on God's many commands that we diligently love one another.
- Consider your peaceful God!
- Count the cost of disunity
- Be the first to seek peace & reconciliation (initiate & be proactive)
- Judge yourself *more than* you judge others.
- Pursue humility (and great lowliness & meekness)

Unity, peace, truth...

J.C. Ryle, "The Fallibility of Ministers"

Do not put implicit confidence in any man's opinion, merely because he is a minister.

What are the best of ministers but mendust, ashes and claymen with a nature like our own, men exposed to temptations, men liable to weaknesses and failings.

They have often driven the truth into the wilderness, and decreed that to be true, which was false. The greatest errors have been begun by ministers.

Peace without truth is a false peace; it is the very peace of the devil.

Unity without the gospel is a worthless unity; it is the very unity of hell.

We ought to contend jealously for the truth and to fear the loss of truth more that the loss of peace.

To maintain pure truth in the church, we should be ready to make any sacrifice, to hazard peace, to risk dissension and run the chance of division.

Never let us be guilty of sacrificing any portion of truth on the altar of peace.

We should no more tolerate false doctrine than we would tolerate sin.

To regularly hear unscriptural teaching is a serious thing. Is is a continual dropping of slow poison into the mind.

Let us receive nothing, believe nothing, follow nothing which is not in the Bible, nor can be proved by the Bible.
