The "inspiration" of this passage

"Salt": It is a warning regarding "losing its savor" (Luke 14:34)

It is used in reference to a discourse on the reality of hell (Mark

9:49-50)

"Light": Jesus is "the light of the world" (John 8:12)

Believers are "agents" of light in a dark world (2 Cor. 4:4)

The "doctrine" of this passage

The "potential" (v.13) – "Ye are the salt of the earth, but. . . trodden under foot of men."

Israel is the "salt of the earth": Is. 49:6, "to the gentiles"

Israel "lost his savor":

Matt. 27:25; Acts 7:54-60
Israel was "cast out":

The dispersion of 70AD
Israel has been "trodden under":

Edict of exp. (1492); Holocaust

(20th cent.)

The "promise" (v.14) – "Ye are the light. . . a city that is set on a hill and cannot be hid"

Israel possesses an "everlasting covenant": Gen. 17:7; 2 Samuel 7:13

Jesus promised Israel would "return": Matt. 24:32-35

Those who care for Israelites are blessed: Gen. 12:3; Psalm 122

The "response" (v.15) – "Neither. . . put it under a bushel. . . giveth light unto all in the house"

Egypt was blessed because of Joseph: Gen. 37-50 The "wilderness" was blessed of Israel: Exodus 16 Babylon was blessed because of Daniel:Daniel 1-7

** our culture has been blessed by Israel: 1492-1948

The "restoration" (v.16) – "Let your light so shine before men. . .glorify your Father"

Geographical restoration: 1917 (Balfour declaration); 1948 (United

Nations)

1967 (6 day war); 1973 (Yom Kippur war)

Religious restoration: Rev. 7:1-8 (tribes); Rev. 11:1-2 (temple)

Spiritual restoration: Rev. 7:9 (souls)
