- promised before προεπηγγείλατο, to assert unto action long before; Gal 3.8 (Gn 12.3)
 - Continuity of purpose/aim
- 4. through δ_{1a} , the means or instrument by which it is effected
 - Continuity of divine character
- 5. His prophets τῶν προφητῶν αὐτου, his ones who spoke forth to make it known/announce; Dt 18.20,22
 - Continuity of prophetic authority
- 6. Holy ayiaic, revered on account of its association with God; WCF 1.5, Eph 4.4-6
 - Continuity of indwelling testimony
- 7. Scriptures γραφαῖς, writings/sacred books of the Old Testament; 2Tim 3.15-17, Ac 17.11
 - Continuity of written revelation
