UN Ambassador Gilad Erdan addresses UN Security

Thank you, Mr. President.

This war can end tomorrow, even today. If Hamas returns all of the hostages and turns in all the terrorists who took part in the massacre, a real ceasefire can be achieved that will last decades. Demand this of Hamas! This is the solution!

On November 29, 1947, the UN voted to adopt the Partition Plan and the establishment of the Jewish State. Yet while Israel joyfully accepted this resolution, the Arab States rejected it, and instead tried to annihilate Israel. **Today, exactly 76 years later**, history is somewhat repeating itself. Foreign Ministers of some Arab countries have arrived here today in order to support a terror organization that aims to annihilate Israel. Thankfully, the plan to eliminate Israel was unsuccessful then, just as it will be unsuccessful today.

Despite Arab opposition, Israel was born. And not only did Israel survive their attack, but we thrived, becoming a powerhouse of impact, benefitting all of humanity, including our neighbours who live with us in peace.

This deep-seated hatred of Israel and Jews, even before its establishment until this very day, stems from the very same genocidal ideology that drives Hamas. This is not a political conflict or about partitioning land. It is solely about the destruction of Israel and the murder of Jews.

On October 7th, Hamas unleashed an unprovoked act of pure evil upon Israel, massacring the most Jews in one day since the Holocaust. Yet shockingly, here we are nearly two months later, and Hamas' savage crimes still have not been condemned by this body.

How do you expect me to react to this? How would you react if a terror organization massacred thousands of your citizens, abducted hundreds of them, and the Security Council refused to condemn the terrorists?

Hamas has publicly stated that it will repeat October 7 over and over again until Israel is no more. How would you respond and defend your citizens from such a clear threat? With a ceasefire? How can one call for a ceasefire and at the same time claim to seek a solution to the conflict? After all, anyone who supports a ceasefire basically supports Hamas' continued reign of terror in Gaza. Hamas is a genocidal terror organization – they don't hide it – not a reliable partner for peace. Don't you see the contradiction here? Calling for both a ceasefire and peace is a paradox.

This Council must also not remain silent about the Shiite elephant in the room. Iran armed, Iran funded, Iran trained Hamas, but the Ayatollah regime's central role in the ruin of the region has not even been addressed here.

It's not as if Hamas is fighting Israel alone. Hezbollah missiles have been raining down on northern Israeli towns and Iran does not hide its aim of Israel's destruction. Iran publicly supports the October 7th Massacre. Does Iran's central role in destabilizing the security of the Middle East not deserve to even be raised here?

It is clear that the UN has been coopted by those that have no real interest in a solution. Every UN body has been weaponized against Israel.

Today, we will be hearing from some Foreign Ministers of countries that have not even condemned Hamas' massacre. Can we honestly expect them to provide a productive opinion?

The only input that can be valued here is from parties that have condemned Hamas' massacre. This should be the bare minimum. Just look at what has been taking place at the UN over the past week: UN briefers from UNICEF did not even bother to mention Hamas' indoctrination of Gazan children to terror. UN Women did not brief the Council on the savage rape and sexual violence perpetrated by Hamas against Israeli women. And this entire week has been dedicated only to Palestinian solidarity, despite the fact that all of this started only because Hamas carried out a deliberate and unprovoked massacre of Israelis.

Hamas wants more violence. They want to raise Gazan casualties. Why? They want to exploit falsified death tolls just so this Council will ignore their crimes, focus on condemning Israel, and tie our hands. This is their script.

Hamas knows that the international community is their only hope for survival.

The only way to dramatically improve the situation is to support Israel's mission to eradicate Hamas' terror capabilities. I reiterate again, again, and again: this war can end tomorrow, even today. If Hamas returns all of the hostages and turns in all the terrorists who took part in the massacre, a real ceasefire can be achieved that will last decades. Demand this of Hamas! This is the solution!

The time has come for this Council to truly focus on its mandate – security.

Anti-Semitism is on the march globally such as has not been witnessed in a long time, and it is rampant on prominent American university campuses.

"Yesterday, many thousands of Islamofascists and leftists turned out across the globe for pro-Hamas demonstrations, celebrating the massacre of October 7 and demanding the extermination of Jews.

Trafalgar Square was packed to overflowing. Hundreds of thousands turned out in Paris. Some might find the idea of a 'kill the Jews' rally in Berlin alarming. And, of course, many thousands rallied to support genocide against the Jews in Washington, D.C. It looked almost like an insurrection" ("Genocide Is Popular," PowerLine, Nov. 5, 2023).

What is happening? Hatred of the Jews, promoting lies about the Jews, comparing Israel with Hamas, calling for the destruction of the state of Israel--none of this is reasonable.

In 1932, Harold Laski, said of Hitler's anti-Semitic propaganda, *"If the Jews trusted to reason only for the defence of their lives their chance of survival would be relatively small. For the temper in which they are attacked is inherently unamenable to rational discussion"* (cited from "Thought for the Day," PowerLine, Nov. 5). Laski was right, and this is a 2,000-year-old irrationality, but why?

The answer is found only in the Bible. It has to do with the age-old battle between God and a world in rebellion, a world of which Satan, Lucifer, or the Devil is "the god" (2 Corinthians 4:4).

The chief voices of anti-Semitism---Islam, Marxism, Humanism, etc.--are of the Devil.

Israel is not right with her God at present, but that is no reason to hate her. God will take care of Israel and bring her to repentance, as He has promised to do in many prophecies of Holy Scripture.

As the multitudes rage against Israel and her God, we pray for Israel; we pray for Israel's safety; we pray for Israel's repentance.

All the nations banded together with all their might, with Satan at their head, cannot stop it, as the great prophecy of Psalm 2 proclaims.
