Joshua's Great Commission

- I. The path out of <u>despair</u> is to hear the word of God and know that He is <u>compassionate</u>, He is <u>sovereign</u>, and He is faithful to fulfill all His promises (vs 1-5a).
 - i. God has determined to fulfill His decrees through the faithful actions of His chosen people. The giving of the land is a done deal, but the people are required to engage in the battle.
 - ii. He is <u>not</u> dependent on us "Moses my servant is dead; now therefore arise..."
 - iii. Here we have an outline for the entire book of Joshua:

 Chapters 1-5 = entering the land (vs 2). Chapters 6-12 = taking the land (vs 3) Chapters 13-21 = dividing the land (vs 4)

 Chapters 22-24 Joshua's final days (vs 5a)
- II. God's <u>favorable presence</u> is the source of our strength when we commit our hearts to wholehearted <u>obedience</u> to His word (5b-9)
 - i. Almost a perfect chiastic structure.
 - 1. A: "I will be with you"
 - 2. B. "be strong and courageous"
 - 3. C. wholehearted obedience to His word
 - ii. "I will be with you"
 - "Fear not for I am w/ you" Issac 26:22; Moses 3 (who am I) & 4 (mouth); Numbers 14; Deut 20:3-4, 8; 31:6-7, 23 (Psalm 23:4, Is, Jer, Mary Luke 1:28-29)
 - vi. Obedience takes first place in what God wants from us. The whole of Scripture testifies to this fact. Gen 2:16 = obedience to the command was the 1 thing in the garden. Rev 12:17; 14:12-13 descriptive. What was the bridge that closed the chasm between Holy God and sinful man? The obedience of Christi Rom 5:19; Phil 2:8; Heb 5:8-9. You may ask, "what about faith & love?" All are proven by obedience to God's word.



- vii. <u>Obedience</u> demonstrates our faith: see Heb 11 "Hall of Faith" is examples are full of <u>faithful</u> obedience; James 2 "<u>Show me</u>"
- viii. Disobedience is unbelief. Heb 3:12-19
- ix. Love is shown by our obedience: 1 John 2:5-6; 2 John 6; John 14: 18-21
- III. When we determine to obey immediately and completely, God gives us both the strength and the courage we need to obey. (10-18)
 - i. Pattern for success in the book of Joshua: The LORD commands Joshua, Joshua commands the people, the people obey and the LORD faithful to His word (deviation= disaster)
 - ii. Joshua demonstrates his faith by <u>assuming command</u> (he is strong and courageous)
 - iii. Transjordanian tribes (see Numbers 32) = would be most <u>likely</u> to <u>rebel</u>
 - iv. God confirms His promise with the people's response
