DISCUSSION QUESTIONS FOR PRIVATE, FAMILY AND SMALL GROUP FELLOWSHIP

Then consider going back and discussing those that may also be **useful**, including those that may have seemed a bit difficult. In all questions, keep the outline before to identify entries relevant to the question and to look up appropriate verses listed.

- 1. What most surprised, puzzled or impressed you from this sermon?
- 2. What was most helpful? Why? How will you apply it in your daily life?
- 3. What Scripture references were most helpful and why?
- 4. What are the primary *doctrinal* points of this passage? Do you *believe* these things?
- 5. What are the primary *practical* points? Do you do *these* things?
- 6. What is the basic idea in adoption? Where is it found in the OT? In the NT?
- 7. How is man a son of God in creation? Why, then, does he need to be adopted?
- 8. How is each Person in God involved in spiritual adoption?
- 9. How is adoption important to your understanding and appreciation of your salvation? To your approach to unbelievers? To your confidence in God? To your approach to the Christian life? To your hope for the future?
- 10. What is your basic impression of adoption? What is your emotional response? How will this make a difference in what you believe and how you will behave?

FURTHER: Discuss the Larger Catechism (incl. references) & consider memorizing Shorter Catechism on "Justification".

Larger Catechism - Q. 74. *What is adoption?* A. Adoption is an act of the free grace of God, in and for his only Son Jesus Christ, whereby all those that are justified are received into the number of his children, have his name put upon them, the Spirit of his Son given to them, are under his fatherly care and dispensations, admitted to all the liberties and privileges of the sons of God, made heirs of all the promises, and fellow-heirs with Christ in glory. 1 John 3:1; Eph. 1:5; Gal. 4:4-5; John 1:12; 2 Cor. 6:18; Rev. 3:12; Gal. 4:6; Ps. 103:13; Prov. 14:26; Matt. 6:32; Heb. 6:12; Rom. 8:17.

Shorter Catechism

Q. 34. *What is adoption?* A. Adoption is an act of God's free grace, whereby we are received into the number, and have a right to all the privileges, of the sons of God. 1 John 3:1; John 1:12; Rom. 8:17.

Q. 36. *What are the benefits which in this life do accompany or flow from justification, adoption, and sanctification?* A. The benefits which in this life do accompany or flow from justification, adoption, and sanctification, are, assurance of God's love, peace of conscience, joy in the Holy Ghost, increase of grace, and perseverance therein to the end.
