Dóxa - the glorious condition of blessedness into which is appointed and <u>promised</u> that true <u>Christians</u> shall enter after their Savior's return from heaven

II. We Also Take Great <u>Pleasure</u> In Being <u>Squashed</u> – vs. 3b

Thlípsis - a pressing, pressing together, pressure. (metaph. oppression, affliction, tribulation, distress, straits.)

Oída – to know, to understand, to comprehend something

Hypomoné - perseverance, steadfastness, endurance. In the NT the characteristic of a man who is <u>not swerved</u> from his deliberate purpose and his loyalty to <u>faith</u> and <u>piety</u> by even the greatest trials and sufferings.

Dokimé - proving, trial; approved, tried character; a proof, a specimen of tried worth; the quality of being proven to be <u>reliable</u> or dependable.

III. Being Squeezed Increases Our Hope – vs. 4b

Elpís - hope; a looking forward to in <u>confident</u> <u>expectation</u>; (metaphorically an anchor)

IV. God's Assurance Contained In <u>Hope</u> – vs. 5

Kataischýnō - <u>ashame</u>, disgrace, put to shame. One is said to be put to shame who suffers a repulse, or whom some <u>hope</u> has <u>deceived</u>.

Ekchéō - to pour out, shed forth, gush out.(metaph. to bestow or distribute largely.)
