TEXT: Song of Solomon 1:15 Behold, thou art fair, my love; behold, thou art fair; thou hast doves' eyes.

Dove's Eyes: What Men Respond To

16 Behold, thou art fair, my beloved, yea, pleasant: also our bed is green.

17 The beams of our house are cedar, and our rafters of fir.

"...rejoice with the wife of thy youth. **Let her be** as the loving hind and pleasant roe...be thou ravished always with **her love**. And why wilt thou, my son, be ravished with a strange woman...**For** the ways of man are before the eyes of the LORD..." (Prov. 5)

- -In the early 1960s, Helen Andelin, a Mormon, published the book *Fascinating Womanhood*, that sold at least a million copies, as part of the anti-feminist movement.
- -The book was based on a series of booklets from the early 1920's, titled, *Fascinating Womanhood*, by the Psychology Press:

"Thoughtful-minded people have deplored the chaotic conditions which came as an aftermath of the Great War. In no respect were these conditions more delplorable than as they found expression in the 'flapper,' with her seeming disregard of all social coventions that her elders held sacred...Her flippancy, her immodesty of speech, dress and deportment, her sacrilegious...disrespect...[Even the] average girl of today is different...Her flippancy and immodesty is...the result of wrong teaching or wrong thinking...[This book] tells how the *real* attractiveness of genuine womanhood may be cultivated and expressed...These are Nature's laws - God's laws...To win men [a husband] certain definite principles must be followed...They are the

Does she talk about herself? Not she!...her eyes and her attitude show every indication of amazement [for Johnny]...Although Innocent doesn't understand a word of his technicalities, Johnny doesn't care - not while those eyes persist in regarding him as an extraordinary man...'Ive [seen] prettier girls...but none of them has eyes like hers.' Anyone else could see, of course, that the only unusual thing about them is the...respect, approval, and appreciation with which they regard Johnny...Johnny [after a time] proposes...[Now, what is the man's viewpoint? What do they care about?]...a gentle, dainty, lovable and womanly woman [must] have a gentle, lovable, and womanly manner and appearance. A lovely disposition must not be marred by a scowling face and an irritable manner; glorious health must not be disguised by stopping shoulders...and a womanly woman must not be concealed under a mannish appearance and manner... You may, in your own opinion, have such an appearance and manner; but are they distinctly to be seen from a man's point of view?...THE THINGS THAT A WOMAN ADMIRES ANOTHER WOMAN FOR ARE RARELY ATTRACTIVE TO MEN. THE CHARACTERISTICS WHICH THE AVERAGE WOMAN IGNORES OR CONDEMNS IN ANOTHER WOMAN ARE SOMETIMES JUST THE CHARACTERISTICS THAT [MEN LIKE]...As women are more or less blind to [the perspective of men], the first thing you must do, if you would get the man's viewpoint, is to banish all preconceived notions you have about what makes a woman attractive to men [for godly marriage]...Those notions, in all likelihood, are wrong. Women, for example, commonly suppose that one of the main allurements is beauty; but they haven't the slightest conception of what a man considers beautiful. Men never cease to wonder at the inability of women to distinguish beautiful women from others...so with attractiveness of character...Certain men, however, have undertaken to put [these things] in writing...Thackeray describes beauty as...'kind, fresh, smiling...tender...'...'her face blushed with rosy health...smiles, and she had a pair of eyes which sparkled with the brightest and honestest of good humor, except, indeed, when they filled with tears, and that was a great deal too often...'...[In all of these different writings and nationalities, we see men seeking women who] shed joy around...radiate happiness...cast light upon dark days...Her presence lights up the home, her approach is like a cheerful warmth...Both Thackeray and Hugo compare their ideals with a little bird...fresh and joyous...[Some speak of] 'treasing playfulness' [on some occasions]...[and there is] an impression of tenderness and of frailty...'simple innocence'...irreproachable purity and sweetness of character...We now come to the most startling circumstance of all. Neither of these [ladies] is exceptionally beautiful, beauty being considered as applying to appearance alone...[We see great attention given to their smile, their likeness to birds, sparkling eyes and joyous mannerisms, tenderness, frailty, childlikeness, purity and gentleness]..."

- **1 Peter 3:1** Likewise, ye wives, be in subjection to your own husbands; that, **if any obey not** the word, they also may without the word **be won** by the conversation of the wives;
- 2 While they behold your chaste conversation coupled with fear.
- 3 Whose adorning let it not be that outward adorning of plaiting the hair, and of wearing of gold, or of putting on of apparel;
- 4 But let it be the hidden man of the heart, in that which is not corruptible, even the ornament of a meek and quiet spirit, which is **in the sight of God of great price**.
- 5 For after this manner in the old time the holy women also, who trusted in God, adorned themselves, being in subjection unto their own husbands:
- 6 Even as Sara obeyed Abraham, calling him lord: whose daughters ye are, as long as ye do well, and are not afraid with any amazement.
- 7 Likewise, ye husbands, dwell with them according to knowledge, giving honour unto the wife, as unto the weaker vessel, and as being heirs together of the grace of life; that your prayers be not hindered.

"Next, my lovely girls, remember to be courteous and unassuming [not arrogant or haughty]; for there is no more beauteous virtue...For gentleness will tame the most untamable and unapproachable spirit...[A king and queen sought a bride for their son out of certain sisters. One sister was] found attractive in the extreme...but she had a trick of talking too much, and of replying before she had thoroughly understood what it was was put to her...[You] should always thoroughly have caught the meaning of what is said to you, before you reply...[For this reason, another, less attractive sister was chosen as the bride]..."
