"Shall I Not Drink the Cup which My Father Has Given Me?" John 18:1-11

King Jesus lays down His life of His own initiative.

1. Jesus Goes forth to Meet His "Captors!"

vv. 4-6

vv. 7-9

(1) A Perfect Submission to and Confidence in His Father's Will

"Jesus therefore, knowing all things that would come upon Him, went forward and said to them, "Whom are you seeking?"

- "knowing all things that would come upon Him" cf. 13:3

(2) The Strangest "Arrest" in all of History! "Jesus ... said to them, 'Whom are you seeking?' They answered Him, 'Jesus of Nazareth.'"

Q: Who's in charge here?!! A: The Triune God!

- He inquires of them! They must answer Him!
- A great confrontation between light and darkness here!

His "captors" stung by His authority!

"Jesus said to them, 'I am.' Now when He said to them, 'I am,' they drew back and fell to the ground."

- "I am"
 - Echoes the authority of His messianic office the Anointed One of God cf. 6:35; 8:11, 58; 10:7,11; 11:25; 14:6; 15:1,5
- 2. Jesus Intervenes for His Own
 - (1) He protects them from what they otherwise could not bear!
 - Physical harm? Spiritual peril?

 Both!

"Then He asked them again, 'Whom are you seeking?'
And they said, 'Jesus of Nazareth.'
Jesus answered, 'I have told you that I am He.
Therefore, if you seek Me, let these go their way,'
that the saying might be fulfilled which He spoke,
'Of those whom You gave Me I have lost none.'"

- He stands between His own and the powers of darkness lest His people be crushed by the enemy!

(2) The fulfillment of His own word! cf. 17:12

3. Jesus Presses the Necessity of His Sacrifice

vv. 10-11

(1) The Cross <u>Unacceptable</u> to Human Understanding!

"Then Simon Peter, having a sword, drew it and struck the high Priest's servant, and cut off his right ear."

- Peter (again!) resists Jesus' self-humiliation and self-offering
 - cf. Matt. 16:21-23
 - He now stands in the way by resorting to violence!

(2) To Jesus: "The Cup" which His Father Had Given Him

-1- Jesus must restrain Peter!

"Put your sword into the sheath.

Shall I not drink the cup
which My Father has given Me?"

Jesus must often restrain His own from the foolishness of their ways!

The harsh and clumsy movements of unbelief.

The spasms of unbelief and of the flesh!

- **-2- The cup of suffering** "Shall I not certainly drink the cup...?"
 - That allotted to Him by His Father
 - His portion as the "Sin-bearer"

Further Application:
