<u>Worst days</u>-"When you are stunned and shattered by calamity, a broken dream, or harm you never saw coming, and can't figure out God's intention."

<u>Good days</u>-"When you are fully in the moment, with family, friends, or success, and God couples it with the gift of being able to enjoy it."

<u>Great days</u>-"When maybe near dusk, you are almost afraid the day will end. Because God has nearly burst your senses with wonder, love, tenderness and destiny, touching the deepest part of your being, beyond what you had previously imagined possible."

<u>Best days</u>-"When nearly of out the blue, God reveals the life-transforming experience of a *worst day*, redeemed into purity, meaning, clarity and transcendent joy, long after you'd lost hope it could, or would be."

<u>Redemption</u>=To liberate by payment to release from debt or blame. To *offset*, to *override* the bad effect.

....Either-

- 1) Your God is willing but unable to bring redemption to your worst sadness.
- 2) God is able, but unwilling, because of your lack of faith, to bring redemption to your worst sadness.
- 3) God was able to do more back in the Old Testament when He was stronger and younger.
- 4) God is sometimes overwhelmed by evil and can only offer you His best wishes, and maybe travel mercies.
- 5) Or, God is willing, able and lovingly determined to bring redemption to your worst sadness.

God never makes mistakes concerning you God never says oops God's redemption is never a consolation prize God never plays you God cares more about your loss than you do God suffers more in your loss than you do God thinks more about your loss than you do God loves you more than you do God has already formed this event's redemption from before the world began
