Discussion Questions

The following questions are designed to be used by parents in discussing the sermon with their children, but can be used by anyone in discussing the sermon with others:

- 1. What stood out to you in this sermon? Why?
- 2. What does it mean that God is the Most High (verse 1)?
- 3. What can't the foolish person understand (verses 5-9)? Why not?
- 4. What are palm trees like? What are cedars of Lebanon like? What does it mean that the righteous flourish like the palm tree and grow like a cedar of Lebanon?
- 5. What truths are stated about the Lord in verse 15? What do they mean?
- 6. What are two things stated in this psalm for which you have not been thanking the Lord, but should start thanking Him regularly?

Going Deeper:

These questions are designed for the believer to use in prayer with his/her Lord, and in discussion with brothers and sisters in the Lord:

- 1. How did this sermon challenge your thinking, or grow your understanding?
- 2. What all does it mean that it is *good* to give thanks to the Lord?
- 3. Do you consistently find joy in the Lord's works and in praising His works (verse 4)? Explain.
- 4. Verses 5-15 speak of the Lord's punishment of the wicked and blessing of the righteous. How much of this occurs on this side of eternity? How much will occur in eternity? Why is it very important to understand that some of this will be fulfilled in eternity?
- 5. What do verses 12-15 teach about God's intention for His people as they grow old? How does this compare to what you envision for yourself when you grow old? What hindrances and temptations do we typically face as we grow old? How can these hindrances and temptations be overcome in order to live out verses 12-15?
- 6. What is the primary way you should be affected by this psalm this week?
