

The Sealed Servants

As the Seal Judgments conclude, especially, the sixth seal, they have revealed *the* ______ of the Lamb. - They have a Divine _____(7.2, 14.1) The servants have a Divinely placed seal on their ______(7.3). This seal is likely the ______ of God (14.1). This seal will be replicated by Satan (13.16). In ancient time, a seal was set on the forehead of a ______ and on the ______ of the soldier.
- 2) **They have a Distinct** (7.4) Some would argue that their sum is symbolic of all saints. However, the specificity of the number is continually used. There are 12 groups of 12,000 men. This number is restated later as well (14.3).
- 3) They have Demographic _______ (7.5-8) Each of these servants are of the house of _______. In fact, they are from each tribe. Two tribes are not mentioned: _______ and ______. Ephraim is seemingly substituted by _______ (7.8). Dan is seemingly substituted by _______ (7.7). There is no reason given for this substitution. Two theories exist for the substitutions. 1) Both Dan (especially) and Ephraim had a remarkable connection with _______ in Israel (Deut. 29.18-21). It should be noted that when that Millennial age commences, Dan is the ______ (Ephraim is 5th)

to receive their distribution of the land (Ezek. 48.2). 2) The Tribe of Dan is pictured as both a ______ and a _____ (Deut. 33.22, Gen. 49.17). Only one other is pictured as such-_____. Some believe that the ______ will come through the line of _____ (Dan. 11.36-37), hence his omission in this list. Both of these theories are speculation.

- 4) They have a Determined ______ These servants are linked with the great ______ of believers that will exist during the Tribulational period (7.9). These determined servants will seem to ______ the Gospel of the Lamb during the entirety of the Tribulation. Many shall be saved by faith, and many of those Tribulational saints shall be martyred (6.11, 7.16, 20.4)
- 5) They have Defended Survival The duration of these servant's ministry seems to be the length of the 70th week. During such time, they will be on earth when the ______ of God is set loose (Rev. 6). Yet, at least some of the judgments will have ______ effect upon them (9.4). Equally, their loyalty to Christ (the Lamb) will cause them to be ______, but they will not be caught. God will ______ them! Their ministry seems sustained (like Elijah) by the power of God.
- 6) **They have a Dedication to the** ______ Their ______ to Christ will be impeccable. They will not receive the ______ of the beast, but will have a ______ song that is theirs alone to sing (14.2-3)
- 7) They have a Devout Sanctification (14.4) These 144,000 servants will be ______ males without ______ or _____. They will have as a primary purpose the proclamation of the Gospel of the Lamb. They are the ________of the great promised ______ of Israel that shall come (Zech. 12.10, Rom. 11.26).

Perhaps these sealed servants will be sent _____ by _____ like the seventy were sent (Luke 10.1). Perhaps, God will ______ them to the presence of men that are diligently seeking like Philip was sent to the Eunuch (Acts 8.26,39).
